Samuel Wolfe a witness of lawful age produced on the part of the Complainant being duly sworn and examined for interrogatories filed with the Commissioner by the Solicitor for Complainant and herewith returned deposes and Says. In the 1st Interrogatory & Answer - William Bruner he is dead he died sometime in the year 1858 - I do not know whether he died intestate or not I do not know whether he left sufficient personal property to pay his debts. In the 2^d Interrogatory. He left a widow and one child who resides in Frederick County. The Childs name is Catharine Louisa Bruner, and the widow Catharine Bruner. He did not leave any other heirs at law. In the 3^d Interrogatory deceased purchased certain app. estate from Cornelius Wolfe living in Frederick County in the latter part of 1858. Thinks that dec^d contracted to pay something over two hundred dollars for the real estate. Does not know when the purchase money became due. Does not know what sum is now due from deceased estate to Cornelius Wolfe on the said real estate. Does not know what additional sum deceased owed to Cornelius Wolfe at the time of his death. The real estate mentioned in the paper now shown me the Bill of Complaint in this Cause is all the real estate of which William Bruner died seized & possessed. There being no further testimony and no further time being required for the production of Witnesses I have closed this Commission and herewith return the same under my hand and seal this 5th day of April 1860.
