The Court and several answers of Lese J. Boyer & Mary J. Boyer his wife and prorses L. Thomas defendants to the bill of Complaint of the Jefferson Circuit Beneficent Society of the Methodist Protestant Church filed against these defendants & others in the Circuit Court for Frederick's County sitting as a Court of Equity. These defendants for answer say they admit that Peter Boyer was in his lifetime indebted by his single bill to D. Light Wilson & John St. Charlton trustee in N^o 2799 Equity in the sum of fourteen thousand dollars with interest from date & that the payments of said sum of money was secured by a mortgage of the real estate therein specified executed by said Peter Boyer & Mary Boyer his wife that the paper filed as exhibit N^o 2 is said deed of Mortgage that said Peter Boyer died sometime in the month of January 1861 leaving said money unpaid and that said Single Bill & Mortgage are original papers that said Peter Boyer died leaving Mary Boyer as his widow & as his heirs at law the children named in said bill of Complaint these defendants admit all the other facts stated in said bill of Complaint and are willing a decree shall pass as therein proposed for the sale of said Mortgage premium for the purposes therein set forth
