The Bill states that on the
3^d day of March 1854 a decree was passed in the case of
James W. Harlan and Nancy Harlan against David Wagner
& others for all said House and Lot of ground as the property
of John W. Harland late of said County deceased for the benefit
of his heirs at law in the Circuit Court for Frederick County
as a Court of Equity that the said Moses Andrus was appointed
trustee said sale was accepted the trust and complied with
the terms of said decree and on the 8th day of April he as such
Trustee sold at public sale said House and Lot of ground
to Nancy Harlan who was the highest bidder and purchaser for
the sum of seven hundred and fifty dollars that he reported
said sale to the Honorable Court as a Court of Equity in said
Case No 2504 Equity which sale was finally ratified & confirmed

paid to said trustee the purchase money except the sum of
