Pursuant to notice given to the  
parties under the order of the Court, I met pursuant to notice  
at my office on Wednesday the 11th day of January 1860 & then and  
there proceeded to take the following depositions to Wit.

Thomas Kinna a witness of lawful age produced on the  
part of James Water a Credit being duly sworn deposes and says  
that he knew James Kinna. It is said he died the third of  
January 1857, I have seen him write and from his handwriting  
I look at the paper now shown unscrupled James Water claim N<sup>o</sup> 56  
the signature to that note is in the handwriting of James Kinna  
now deceased, the endorsement on the back of the paper being a credit  
of thirty six dollars is in my hand writing the payment was made  
at the time it purports to bear date, I made that entry by authority  
of my father James Kinna. I paid that money as his agent (it is  
admitted that the claim N<sup>o</sup> 56 was proved and passed before the Orphans  
Court of Frederick County as it purports upon its face.

I was the agent of my father James Kinna and as such agent  
was in the habit of securing wheat for him at the upper Mills -  
I look at the paper now shown unscrupled Exhibits 1 & 2 to claim  
N<sup>o</sup> 71 the receipts are in my hand writing as agent of James Kinna  
and the wheat therein mentioned went for my father use, there is  
no account in bar or payment except the credit endorsed on claim N<sup>o</sup> 71
