Pursuant to notice given to the  
 parties under the order of the Court I met at my office on  
 Thursday the 31st day of May 1860 & them & their proceeds to take  
 the following depositions to wit: Robert Boone a witness of  
 lawful age produced on the part of Sampson Kinna & Thomas  
 Kinna the creditors opposing claim. I got King duly sworn  
 deposes & says I was the agent of the Marchioness of Wellerby  
 from 1850 to the present time & in 1853 as such agent I rented  
 a farm on Carrolls Manor to Hezekiah Floyd containing about  
 2400 acres of land at \$3 per acre & said rent contained down  
 to the end of the year 1857. I have been paid by said Floyd  
 the whole of said rent. By my consent Floyd subrented to  
 James Kinna about 65 to 70 acres of said land at \$2.75 per acre  
 for 3 years to the end of the year 1857. In the winter of 1858 I had  
 a conversation with James Kinna the said he owes Floyd two years  
 rent for said land & claimed a credit on said rent. I am  
 acquainted with the paraventions of Hezekiah Floyd from having  
 seen him write I took up the signature for the assignment of  
 James Kinna on claim N<sup>o</sup> 48 the signature "Hezekiah Floyd" is the  
 handwriting of said Floyd David Kinna a witness of lawful
