They cannot agree upon the division of the said real estate as a part of the Holders at law are infants or minors under the age of twenty one year, and if said real estate is not susceptible of partition amongst the parties interested aforesaid with advantage to all of them then your orators and orator to have proceedings under the act to select depute to make partition &c.

Or under consideration whereof and for that your orators are remedied in the premises by the strict rule of the Common Law and equitable in a Court of Equity when matters of this nature are properly Cognizable.

By the and therefore that the said Margaret Baker and Larina Baker the infant defendants may full true and perfect answers make to this bill of Complaint according to the rules and practice of this Court.

May it please your Honor to order - adjudge and decree that a Commission be issued to five discreet reputable men to be Commissioners authorizing and empowering them or a majority of them to make partition of said real estate, and to proceed in all things appertaining to said estate according to the provisions of the forty seventh Article of the Maryland Code of public general laws. And may it please your Honor to extend unto your orators and orator all such other and further relief in the premises as the nature and Circumstances of the case may require and as to your Honor shall seem just and equitable &c.

May it please your Honor to grant unto orators and orator the State of Maryland writ of subpoena to be directed to the said Margaret Baker and Larina Baker the infant defendants thereby commanding them at a certain day to be and appear before your Honor in the Honorable Court there and there to answer all and singular the premises &c &c And your orators will ever pray.
