Copy Exhibit A - Plat of "Yule Play"

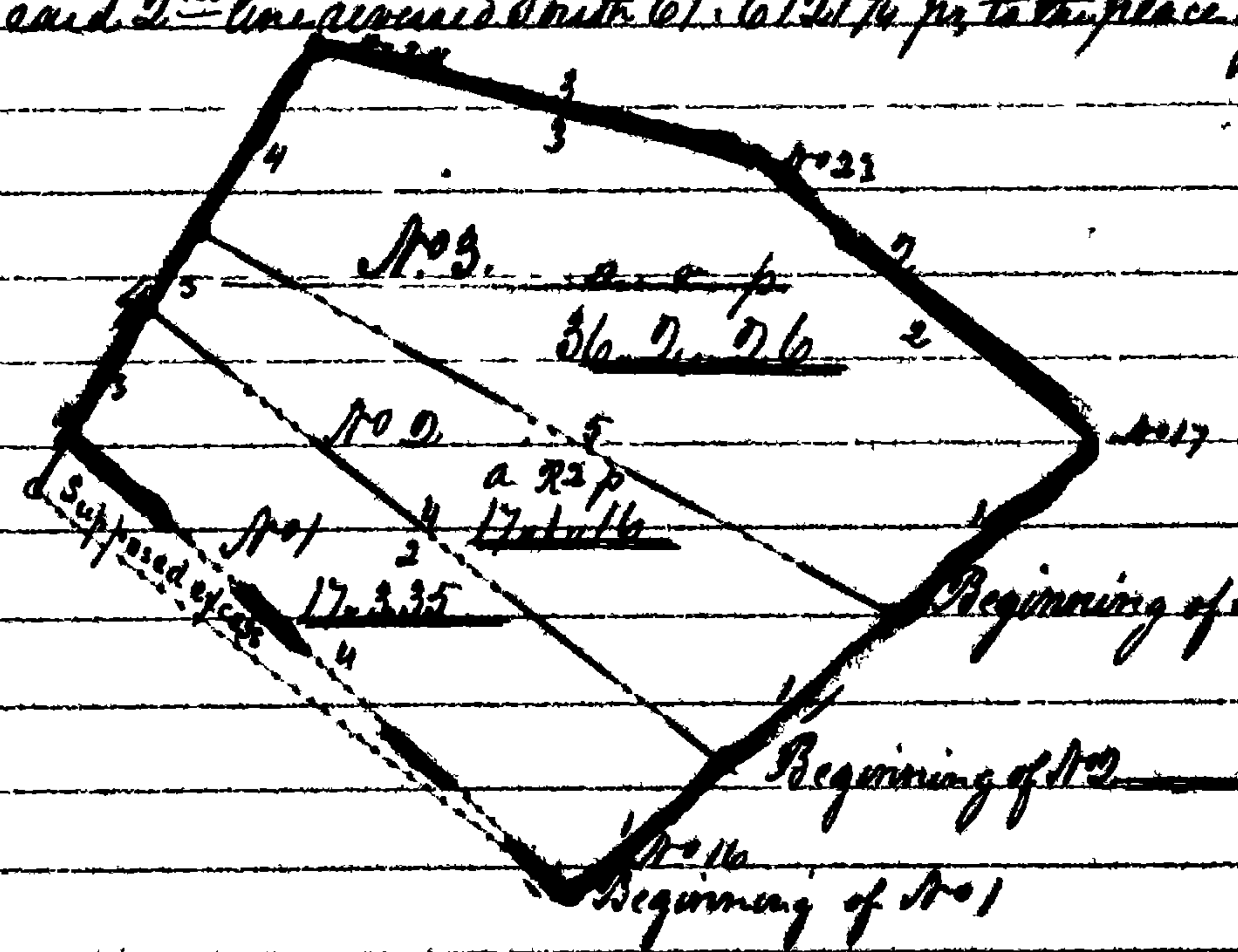
At the request of Lewis M. and Henry M. Bridgoff, Trustees for the sale of the Real Estate of Henry Bridgoff late of Frederick County deceased, I have carefully surveyed Lot No. 16, part of a tract of land called "Yule Play," being the parcel of land devised by Jacob and Michael Keiper Trustees, to Henry Bridgoff the 30th of May 1848 for 7 1/4 acres, as shown under the same into lots as follows

Lot No. 1. Beginning at a stone formerly planted and marked N^o 16, it being the beginning of the whole Lot No. 16, it being the beginning of the whole Lot No. 16, and running thence with the 1st line thereof with a correction as to agree with the original location viz: N 48 3/4° E 30 7/8 ft to a stake and pile of stones, then a Rock or stake marked with 12 rocks, then N 51° W 112 ft to a stake and pile of stones, at the south end of a rock, two Rock marks, and a Hickory tree marked as pointing, being in the 4th line of the whole Lot No. 16, aforesaid, then with said 4th line, correcting as aforesaid, S 82 1/2° W 23 ft to a stake and pile of stones, or a rock, then S 4 1/2° E 10 1/2 ft to the place of beginning, containing 17 acres, 3 rods, and 35 square perches.

Lot No. 2.
