

Exhibit S.H. 'Hiddens'

At the request of Lewis M. and Henry M. Hiddoff, Executors for the sale of the Real estate of Henry Hiddoff, late of Hedrick County, deceased, I have carefully surveyed part of a tract of land called "Hiddens" being a part of the parcel of said tract distinguished designated in a division made as Lot No. 4, and which was decreed by James Hughes of Louisville, Kentucky by Decree of the Court with an attachment of John Hughes, deceased, to Henry Hiddoff the 10th day of January 1832, for 50th acres. Beginning for this part of said Lot at a heap of stones at the end of 44 paces on the 6th line of said Lot No. 4, and running thence N 13^o 11' W 13 paces to a stake and pile of stones, N 60^o 10' W 13 paces to a stake and pile of stones, N 13^o 11' W 13 paces to intersect the 3rd line of said Lot No. 4, then by and with said 3rd line S 60^o 10' W 44 paces to a stake and pile of stones at the end of the 3rd line of 9 acres part of the 50th acres dec'd of record sold off by the said Henry Hiddoff to William Decker, then with the 3rd line of said 9 acres parcel covered S 1^o 24' E 44¹/₂ paces to the end of 40 paces on the 6th and 7^o 5' E 98 paces line of the whole 50th acres dec'd of record, then with said 6th line S 75^o E 58 paces to the end thereof, then S 58^o E 44 paces to the place of beginning, containing 46 acres, 2 cords, and 13 square perches.

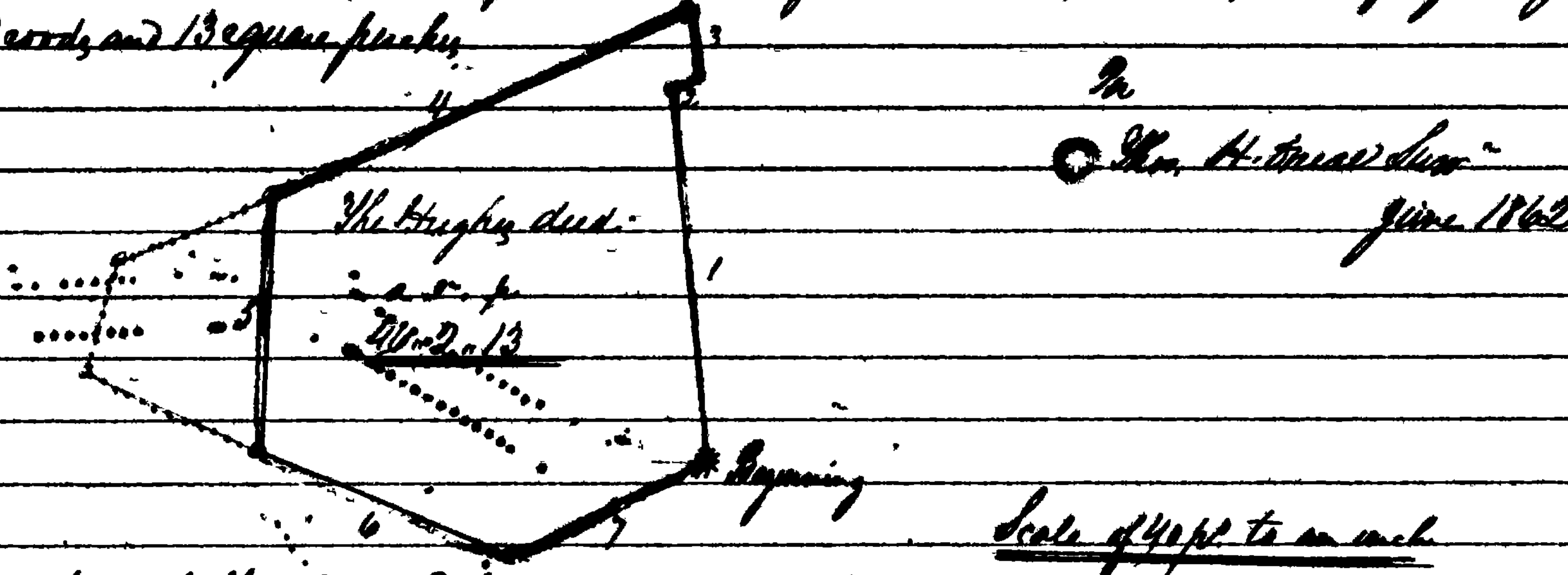


Exhibit S.H. - the Farm Water Exhibit No. 2 as to Lots in Alabama

At the request of Lewis M. and Henry M. Hiddoff, Executors for the sale of the Real estate of Henry Hiddoff, late of Hedrick County, deceased, I have surveyed the Alabama Farm, part of a tract of land called "Pleasant Prospect", and have laid off the portion thereof lying on the George Vain road into 22 lots, as is seen by the plat below.

The Farm Beginning at a stake and pile of stones in the situation aforesaid, it being the beginning of the whole tract called "Pleasant Prospect" and running thence with the outline thereof two courses, S 46^o 11' W 85 paces to a stone formerly planted S 50^o 31' W 91¹/₂ paces to a stake at the end of 21¹/₂ paces on a line drawn N 55^o 11' W from the North West corner of said 11th E. Howard's lot then with said line covered S 55^o E 21¹/₂ paces to the North West corner of said 11th E. Howard's lot, then with the Northern line of several lots hereafter sold off, S 55^o E 16 paces to the middle of an inlet twenty feet wide covered for the benefit of the farm, now being decided, on the contiguous lots - which inlet bears S 87^o 11' to the George Vain road, then South 44^o E 3¹/₂ paces to the North West corner of William H. Haugh's lot and the North East corner of Stone House lot then with the latter line of said Haugh's lot as now enclosed S 68^o E 17 paces to the North West corner of Mrs. Mary Winder's lot, then with the Northern line of said Winder's lot S 77^o E 7¹/₂ paces to a stone formerly planted at the North East corner thereof, then with the Eastern line of said lot S 21¹/₄ W 13¹/₂ paces to a stone formerly planted in the Northern side of the George Vain road, then in said road S 49^o E 1¹/₂ paces then N 20^o E 13¹/₂ paces to a stake at the end of 2¹/₂ paces on a line drawn S 85^o E from the stone planted at the North East corner of Mrs. Mary Winder's lot aforesaid, then S 85^o E 39 paces to the North West corner of Sebastian G. Cocke's lot, then with Northern line of said lot S 89^o E 7¹/₂ paces to the 7th or 11th W 36¹/₂ paces line of 22 acres and 23 square perches, part of "Pleasant Prospect" aforesaid, sold by Henry Hiddoff to Richard H. Phillips, then with said 7th line covered S 1^o E 2¹/₂ paces to the end of the 6th line of said 22^o 36¹/₂ paces parcel, then with the line of said Phillips' parcel covered, three courses and a distance, S 45^o E 16¹/₂ paces, S 70^o E 66 paces, S 35^o E 32 paces to the Middle of the Pullen road leading from Alabama to New Market, it also being the end of 30 paces on the 9th line of the whole tract called "Pleasant Prospect" then with the said 9th line, and in the road last named S 56^o E 19 paces to the end of said line, still by and with the outline of the whole tract aforesaid, six courses and a distance, S 3^o 27' W 12¹/₂ paces to a stake, S 55^o 33' E 68 paces to a stone formerly planted, N 92^o 27' W 28 paces to a stone formerly planted, N 57^o 27' W 54 paces to a stake, S 47^o 33' W 32 paces to a stake near spring house, N 70^o W 64 paces to the place of beginning, containing 126 acres, 3 cords, and 22 square perches.
