Hook one of the defendants in this cause at and for the sum of \$175. per acre the whole amounting to the sum of \$2503.54 and upon the following terms \$500. to be paid the 1st day of April 1857, the residue in two equal annual payments, with interest from the 1st day of April 1857. The Bill further states that the said Jacob C. Hook, on the 1st day of April 1857, paid the sum of \$1200. in part payment of the purchase money, and that also on the 1st day of April 1859, the said Jacob C.
