Ramsburg before he proceeds to act as Trustee, give bond to the Court of the State of Maryland in the penalty of three thousand five hundred dollars with security to be approved by this Court on the bond thereof, conditioned for the faithful discharge of the duties imposed by this decree, or which may be imposed in him by any future decree or order in the premises - He shall then proceed to execute the trusts benefitted by Henry Brone Trustee in the manner prescribed by the original decree passed in this cause.
