 The Bill further states that the said Jacob L. Hook, on the 1st day of April 1857, paid the sum of \$1200, in part pay-
 ment of the purchase money; and that also on the 1st day of April 1859, the said Jacob L. Hook has paid the sum
 of \$800, as part payment of the purchase money. Another Bill charges that the residue of the purchase
 money with the interest thereon is still due and unpaid and that the said unpaid purchase money is a
 Public Lien on said land. The Bill further states that the said Leonard Bone, did in testate some time in the
