Abstract from the Last Will and Testament of Peter Grove, late of Frederick County deceased, executed on the 29th day of November 1833, and probated on the 16th day of December 1833 ~ Item, I give, devise and bequeath unto my son Elias Grove all my Real Estate consisting of the following Tracts or parts of Tracts or Parcels of Land, that is to say: All that Tract of Land called the "Barn" containing 38 $\frac{1}{4}$ Acres, part of a Tract of Land called "Chestnut Level" containing 11 $\frac{1}{4}$ Acres, and all that Tract of Mountain Land name not recollected containing 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ Acres, which lands I give and devise unto him the said Elias Grove, his Heirs and assigns forever, reserving and excepting, one third of the whole of the profits thereof, during the natural life of my wife Catharine Grove; which said third of the profits is otherwise hereinafter disposed of. I also give and bequeath unto my son Elias Grove, and to his heirs and assigns all my Personal Estate of what kind or nature soever, reserving and excepting one of my best Beds, and one of my best Cows, which is otherwise hereinafter disposed of. ~

At the request of Peter Grove the following Deed is recorded, 11th November 1813, to wit ~

This Indenture made this ninth day of November in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirteen between Valentine Buckley of Frederick County and State of Maryland of the one part, and Peter Grove of the County and State aforesaid of the other part Witnesseth, that the said Valentine Buckley for and in consideration of the sum of one thousand and fifty dollars current money to him in hand paid by the said Peter Grove, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, hath granted, bargained, sold, released and confirmed, and by these presents doth grant bargain, sell release and confirm unto the Peter Grove his heirs and assigns, all his the said Valentine Buckley's estate right, title, and interest of ~~an~~ and to, all that tract piece or parcel of land called the "Barn", situated, lying and being in the County aforesaid. Beginning at a bounded white oak standing on the South East side of a hill near Piscarorah, and running thence South seventy two degrees East twenty six perches North Seventeen degrees East twenty six perches, North sixty nine degrees East fourteen perches North eleven degrees East twenty six perches, North forty two degrees West twenty eight perches, North fourteen degrees East thirty perches, North sixty eight degrees West twenty perches, South thirty four degrees West twenty three perches, North eighty three degrees West sixty perches, then by a straight line to the beginning tree, containing thirty eight acres of land more or less, Together with the rights, members, privileges, advantages, and appurtenances, to the same tract, piece or parcel of land belonging or appertaining, and the reversions and reversions, remainder and remainders
