Himes Amanda McHimes, and Martha Ellen Himes of Frederick County, Greeting. - You are hereby commanded that all excuses set apart, you personally appear before the Judge of the Circuit Court for Frederick County, sitting as a Court of Equity, to be held at the Court House in Frederick Town, in and for said County, on the First Monday of July next to answer the Bill and Complaint of Christian Harman & others against you in our said Court, exhibited, and so forth. - Hereof, fail you not, as you will answer at your peril. Witness the Honourable Madison Nelson, Judge of our said Court, the Eighth day of April 1864. - Issued the 20th day of April 1864 -

The object of this Bill is to procure a Decree
for the sale of certain real estate, situate in Frederick
County, State of Maryland, of which Hannah

Stettinmeyer late of Frederick County deceased, died seized and possessed -

The Bill states that Hannah Stettinmeyer died intestate some time in the month
of December Eighteen hundred and Sixty two seized and possessed of eleven undivided
twelfths of a part of a tract of Land called "Yosts Claim Calverys" containing eight
acres of land more or less, - and that at the time of her death she left certain children and
grand children her heirs at law who are named in the said Bill of Complaint.

The Bill further states that two of the said heirs, by deeds, there in exhibited, conveyed
all their right, title and interest in said Estate to a certain Rebecca Stettinmeyer - and
that Elizabeth Himes a daughter of said intestate, died before her said Mother seized
and possessed of one undivided twelfth part of the said real Estate described in said
proceedings, and at her death she left a husband William Himes who is entitled
as tenant by courtesy in said undivided twelfth part of said real Estate, and certain
children her heirs at law described in said Bill, all of whom are infants under
the age of twenty one years, and who reside in the State of Maryland, except Hannah
C. Himes who is a non resident and resides in the State of Ohio - and that the said
real estate is held by the Complainants and the Children of Elizabeth Himes as
tenants in common in unequal proportions. - The Bill further states that
the said real Estate, cannot be divided without loss or injury to the parties
interested, that it would be to the interest and advantage of all, that the
property be sold, and the proceeds of sale divided, among all concerned accord-
ing to their several and respective interests. - It is therefore this 20th day
of April in the year Eighteen hundred and Sixty four, Ordered that the Complain-
ants by causing a Copy of this Order to be inserted in some newspaper published in Frederick
County once a week for four successive weeks before the twenty fourth day of
May Eighteen hundred and Sixty four, give notice to the said absent defendants
of the object and substance of this Bill, and warn her to appear in this Court
in person or by Solicitor, on or before the twenty fifth day of August in the year
Eighteen hundred and Sixty four, to answer the premises and shew cause if
any she have why a decree ought not to pass as prayed. -
