3rd Int. Did or did not the said Hannah Stotte-
 myer leave children and grand-children
 her heirs at law? If yes, state their names, ages
 and present places of residence.

4th Int. Did you or did you not know Nelson
 Stottlemeyer senior deceased? If yes, is he dead, and when did he die? Do you or do you
 not know, whether he died seized and possessed at the time of his death of the lands
 described in Exhibit No. 1 filed in this cause? If yes, did he leave children? If yes
 state their names - which are adults, and which minors - and the names of the
 husbands or wives of such heirs, and their places of residence - and if any
 of such children are dead - which of them, and if any daughters have left
 husbands and children surviving, their names ages and place of residence.

5th Int. Did or did not the said Hannah Stottlemeyer die seized and possessed
