

Henry Snurr, a witness of lawful age, produced on the part of the Complainant being duly sworn and examined to interrogatories filed with the Commissioner by the Complainant and herewith returned deposes and says.

To the 1st Int. - That he knows all of the parties to this suit, and has known them all for many years; That George Snurr married Sophia Long; that Jacob Snurr married Nancy Potts; that Andrew Snurr married Malinda and that Elizabeth A. Snurr married John Peaster, since deceased, and that Mary Snurr married John Beck. That they are all adults and all reside out of the State of Maryland, except Ann C. Snurr who resides in Frederick County, Maryland.

To the 2nd Int. - That they are seized of valuable real estate situated in Frederick County, Maryland, which is described in Exhibit No. 1. now here shown Depoent; that Exhibit No. 1 described all of the Real Estate of which said parties are seized as tenants in common. That said Real Estate is worth seven or eight hundred dollars. That Complainant has 1/9th, Jacob Snurr 1/9th, Elizabeth A. Peaster 1/9th, George Snurr 2/9th and Mary Beck 2/9th interest in said lands.

To the 3rd Int. That said real estate is not susceptible of advantageous division, as there are only five acres of land, and seven parties which would render the parcels too small for advantageous sale or cultivation.

To the 4th Int. That it would be for the benefit and advantage of all parties concerned that said lands should be sold and the proceeds distributed amongst the parties entitled, for the reasons before stated in the preceding interrogatory.

To the 5th Int. That Complainant has tried to effect a sale, but could not get the defendants to agree upon the terms. That Depoent was engaged in trying to effect a sale of the property, but could not get the consent of all parties.

To the 6th Int. That he knows nothing further.

There being no other witnesses present to be examined and the Complainant requiring no further time for the production of her evidences, the Commissioner closed the said Commission, and herewith returns the same under his hand & seal on this Fifth day of August, Eighteen hundred & sixty seven.

The above cause standing ready for a hearing and being submitted, the Bill, Exhibits, Depositions and all other proceedings were by the Court read and considered.

It is therefore, this 6th day of September, in the year Eighteen hundred and sixty seven, by the Honorable Madison Nelson, Circuit Judge for the Fourth Judicial Circuit of the State of Maryland, and by the authority of the Circuit Court for Frederick County, as a Court of Equity, adjudged, ordered and decreed that the land and premises mentioned in these proceedings to be sold for the purpose of partition between the parties, and that W. B. Levy of Frederick County, be, and he is hereby appointed a Trustee to make the said sale, and that the course and manner of his proceeding shall be as follows: He shall first file in the Clerk's office of this Court a bond to the State of Maryland, executed by himself with a surety, or sureties,
