Be it remembered, that on this 14th day of October, One thousand Eight hundred and sixty seven personally appeared Jacob J. C. Miller, before me the subscriber a Justice of the Peace of the State of Maryland, in and for the County of Frederick, and made Oath on the Holy Evangelij of Almighty God that he obtained a note of hand signed by Andrew Snurr, as appears by reference to his account Book at the same time produced before me calling for twenty one dollars, payable in nine days after date, and bears date on the first day of August, One thousand Eight hundred and fifty four, and the said Andrew Snurr, gave the same as a balance due said Miller, on settlement, on the day aforesaid; And that the said Snurr shortly after left his then residence, thereby preventing the said Deponent from receiving pay therefor. And further that he the said Miller, hath lost, or misplaced said note, and that he hath not, neither hath any person for him, received any parts of the money stated to be due, or any satisfaction or security of any kind for the same.
