And I further command you, that by good and lawful men of your district, you make known unto the person or persons, in whose hands you shall make this attachment, that he, she, or they, be and appear before me the subscriber a Justice of the Peace of the State of Maryland in and for the County of Frederick aforesaid on the 20th day - November next 1867, to show cause, if any he, she, or they have, why the lands, tenements, goods and Chattels, rights and Credits by you attached by virtue of this writ, in his, her, or their hands, shall not be Condemned and execution thereof had and made to and for the use of the said Jacob Beck Miller, as of the the Lands, tenements, goods, Chattels, rights and Credits of the aforesaid Andrew Snurr, according to the act of Assembly in such case made and provided, if to him, her, or them it shall seem meet; and how you shall execute this writ, make known to the said Justice of the Peace, at the day herebefore mentioned and at his Office in Frederick City, in the County of Frederick and State aforesaid, and have you then and there this writ. ~

The Petition of John Mentzer of Frederick County State of Maryland humbly shows that on the second day of December A.D. 1854, before John Alexander Esq. who was at that time a Justice of the Peace in and for said County and State duly elected, commissioned and sworn, your petitioner obtained a judgment against one Jacob Snurr, for Forty five dollars and fifty eight cents debt with interest from the date of said judgment till paid and one dollar and twenty eight cents costs as will more fully appear by reference to the said judgment herewith filed and marked "Exhibit. J.M." which Exhibit your petitioner prays may be taken as a part of his petition ~

Your petitioner further states that he has not directly or indirectly received any part or portion of the said judgment or of the interest thereon, and at some time prior to the year 1856 and long before the expiration of twelve years from the date of the said judgment, the said Jacob Snurr departed beyond the limits of this State and absented himself therefrom and has never since to the knowledge of your petitioner been within this State, and that the said Jacob Snurr has no property real or personal within this State to the knowledge of your petitioner.

Your petitioner further states that he is credibly informed and verily believes that the
