

The object of this suit is to procure a decree for the sale of the real estate of Wm. Howe deceased for the payment of her debts due to the Complainant and others. ~
 The Bill states that said Wm. Howe was in her lifetime indebted to said Complainant on the sum of twenty seven dollars and twenty five cents for articles of furniture purchased of him as Executor of Alexander Howe; That said Wm. Howe died in January 1867, intestate, unmarried and without issue, leaving said money unpaid and due to said Complainant, and also leaving unpaid and due to Ezra Sifer the sum of Two hundred dollars secured by her note and a mortgage of the real estate of said Wm. Howe, which are filed therewith; ~ That said real estate descended to the following heirs at law of said Wm. Howe viz, P. Ann Drill (intermarried with Daniel Dril) a daughter of intestate's sister Eleanor, who, with her husband, Daniel Miller, is dead ~ Margaret Campbell, Anna Campbell, James Campbell, Jr. and ~ Campbell (whose first name is unknown) Children and heirs at law of intestate's niece Ruth, who was a daughter of said Eleanor Miller, and is dead leaving her husband James Campbell surviving her; Frances Ingram, only child and heir of intestate's niece Rebecca, who was a daughter of said Eleanor Miller and is dead, leaving her husband ~ Ingram (whose first name is unknown) surviving her. ~ P. intestate's niece and nephews, the children of her sister Rebecca who with her husband Miller, is dead to wit, S. Ellen Clemson, Mary Ann Pell, William Miller and Henry C. Miller. ~ P. intestate's sister Ann Dayhoff and to the children of intestate's deceased brother John Howe, viz. John P. Howe Samuel A. Howe Margaret Estarding, Charles Howe, and Joseph Howe. ~ That the children and grandchildren of Eleanor Miller reside in Ohio, and the children of Rebecca Miller reside in Illinois. ~ That all the heirs are adults but Frank Ingram who is a minor. ~ That letters of Administration on the estate of said Wm. Howe were granted to said Ann Dayhoff. ~ That the personal estate of said intestate is insolvent, and that it will be necessary to sell the real estate to pay her debts. ~ It is thereupon ordered this 13th day of August 1867 that the Complainant by causing a copy of this order to be inserted in some newspaper printed in Frederick once a week for four successive weeks before the 14th day of September 1867, give notice to said absent defendants of the object and substance of this Bill and warn them to appear in this Court in person or by solicitor on or before the 14th day of December next to answer the premises and show cause if any they have, why a decree should not pass as prayed. ~
