To the Honorable Madison Nelson Judge of the Circuit Court for Frederick County sitting as a Court of Equity ~
 The Bill of Complaint of Thomas W. Lease and Oliver Sam Lease his wife of Frederick County, respectfully sheweth unto your Honor, that sometime in the month of April 1866, Henry Mc Snyder, late of Frederick County died testate, seized and possessed of (among other property) a valuable tract of land, lying and being in Frederick County, of about two hundred and twenty two acres, described in Exhibit N^o 1 filed herewith, which with all other Exhibits filed in this case, your Complainants pray may be taken as a part of their Bill of Complaint, as if here inserted in words and figures; That said Henry Mc Snyder in his last will and testament, among other devise, devised as follows: Item 4th "I give and devise to all my children (Oliver P. Excepted) My Farm containing about two hundred and twenty two acres, more or less; to them their heirs and assigns forever, in fee simple, share and share alike". That said Henry Mc Snyder died, leaving beside the said Oliver P. Snyder, who is excepted from the provisions of the said devise, the following named children, viz. Your Oratrix Oliver Sam Lease, Ann Snyder, Emma Snyder, Henry Mc Snyder, Clarence Snyder, and Fanny Snyder, who under said will took, and now hold said tract of land as tenants in Common, all of which will be more fully seen by reference to said will, a true and certified copy of which is filed herewith marked Exhibit N^o 2. Your Complainants further shew unto your Honor that said Henry M. Clarence and Fanny Snyder are infants, and all the rest of said tenants in Common are adults, and they all live in Frederick County ~ That said land is now rented and rapidly going to waste and the fences and other improvements are getting

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
