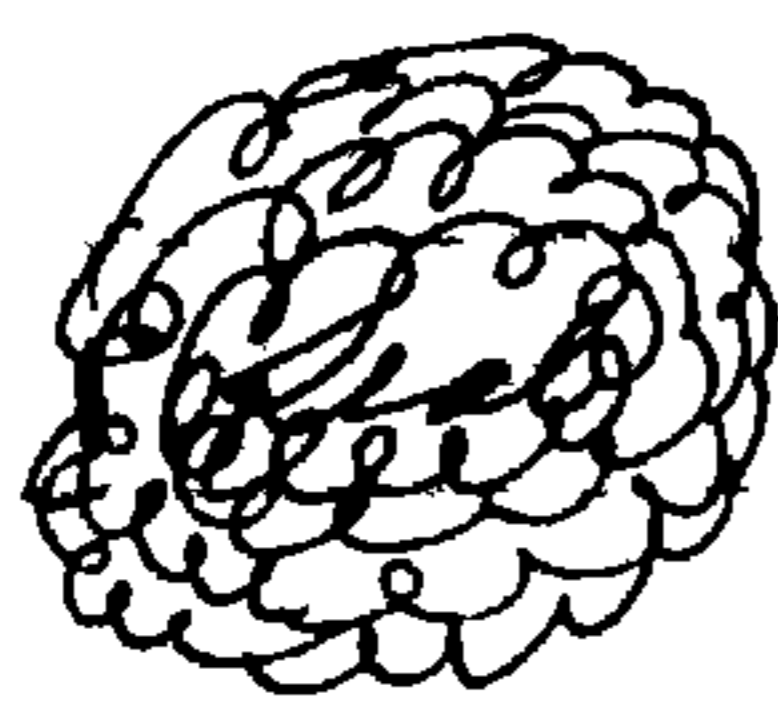


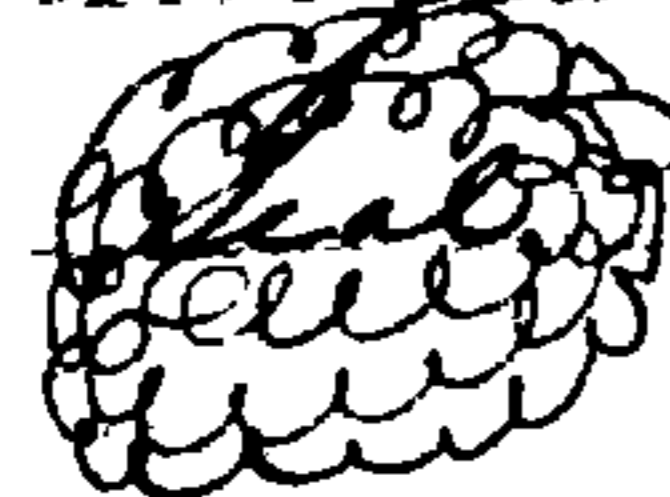

The object of this suit is to procure a decree for the sale of certain real estate in Frederick County, Maryland, which was devised by Philip Stockman late of said County, to his wife Elizabeth Stockman during her natural life, and at her death to his seven children

as named and set forth in the Copy of the Will filed in this case as Exhibit A ~ The Will states further that said real estate lies in Frederick County, and consists of about fifty six acres of arable land, about eight and a half acres of Mountain land, and a house and lot in the Village of Coffers, and is fully described in certified Copies of deeds filed in this case marked Exhibit B, Exhibit C, Exhibit D, Exhibit E and Exhibit F; That said Elizabeth Stockman lately departed this life, unmarried since the death of the said Philip, and that the children of the said Philip, came into possession of said real estate under the provisions of said last Will; that the children named in said will, are Lucia Ann, Mary Ann, John, Christian, Elizabeth Catharine, Polly Margaret, and Barbara Ann Rebecca. That said Lucia Ann married John Unglesbee, both of whom died several years ago leaving George W. Unglesbee, John W. Unglesbee, and Ann S. Thomas the widow of McKee Thomas, their only children and heirs at law. That said Mary Ann married a certain John Smith Sr. and that he died several years ago, leaving six children, namely, Thomas W. Smith, Mary A. married to Solomon Montgomery, Barbara Ann married to some person whose name is unknown to the complainants.
