To the 2<sup>nd</sup> Int. That he was acquainted with Henry Lung, formerly a resident of Frederick County; that he is dead and that he died in Frederick County aforesaid, about three years since.

To the 3<sup>rd</sup> Int. That said Henry Lung left a widow, now living, named Cynthia Ann, aged about forty five years, in good health, and who now resides in Frederick County, Md.

To the 4<sup>th</sup> Int. That he knows the real estate of which said Henry Lung died seized and possessed; that he looks at Exhibits Nos. 1 and 2 now here shown him, and that the real estate therein described is the same of which said Henry Lung died seized and possessed.

To the 5<sup>th</sup> Int. That said Henry Lung died, intestate, leaving the following children, viz. Mary S. married to John S. Stubb, Sarah C. married to John Croshaw, John W. and Henry M. Lung all adults twenty one years of age except Henry M. Lung infant under 21 years of age, and all residents of Frederick County Maryland.

To the 6<sup>th</sup> Int. That said real estate consists of about fourteen acres of land, and is worth about twelve hundred dollars. (\$1200)

To the 7<sup>th</sup> Int. That said lands will not admit of an advantageous division amongst the parties interested, and that it will be to the benefit and advantage of all parties concerned that the same should be sold; because if divided, the parcels would be too small for advantageous cultivation or sale, being situated in the County two miles northwest from Leesagerstown, Frederick County Maryland.

John A. Henge a witness of lawful age produced upon the part of the Complainants, being duly sworn and examined to interrogatories filed with the Commissioners by the Complainant and herewith returned, deposes and says

To the 1<sup>st</sup> Int. That he knows the parties to this suit and has known them all for some years.

To the 2<sup>nd</sup> Int. That he knows Henry Lung; that he died about three years ago in Frederick County Maryland.

To the 3<sup>rd</sup> Int. That said Henry Lung died intestate, leaving a widow named Cynthia Ann, aged about forty five years, in good health, and resides in Frederick County Maryland.

To the 4<sup>th</sup> Int. That he knows the lands of which said Henry Lung died seized and possessed, and that the lands described in Exhibits Nos. 1 & 2 are the same of which the said Henry Lung died seized and possessed.

To the 5<sup>th</sup> Int. That said Henry Lung, died intestate, and left the following children, namely, Mary S. married to John S. Stubb, Sarah C. married to John Croshaw, John W. Lung and Henry M. Lung, who are all <sup>adults</sup> except Henry M. Lung, who is an infant under twenty one years of age and who all reside in Frederick County Maryland.

To the 6<sup>th</sup> Int. That said real estate consists of about fourteen acres of land, and is worth twelve hundred dollars.

To the 7<sup>th</sup> Int. That said lands will not admit of an advantageous division among the parties interested and that it will be for the benefit and advantage of all the parties, that the same should be sold; that said land is situated in the County, two miles from Leesagerstown, Frederick County, Md., and if divided, the parcels will be too small for advantageous cultivation or sale.

There being no other witnesses present to be examined, and the Complainants requiring no further time for the production of their evidences, the Commissioners closed the said Commission and herewith returns the same under his hand and seal on this 4<sup>th</sup> day of November 1864.
