

a bill was filed in your Hon Court in the above cause praying the sale of the real estate of which Henry Baum dec^d. died seized and possessed, that in accordance therewith a decree was passed by your Hon. Court on the 4th day of Dec. 1867 whereby David Birley was appointed trustee, and authorized to make such sale, which he accordingly did, and reported the same to your Honorable Court, which report was duly ratified and confirmed on the 10th day of Feb 1868, and said trustee now holds the proceeds of sale subject to the order of the Court, all of which will fully appear by reference to the proceedings in the above cause; Your petitioner further shews that she was appointed by the Orphan's Court for Frederick County, Administratrix of the goods and chattels &c of said Henry Baum dec^d; that she fully administered upon the same and when she made her final settlement with said Orphan's Court, it was ascertained that there were debts proved and passed by said Court, against said Estate to the amount of \$193.94 and that your petitioner only had funds of said Estate with which to pay said claims to the amt. of \$49.45 whereupon a liquidation was made by said Orphan's Court, distributing the said amount of \$49.45, pro rata among the various claimants, and paying 25% per cent of the full amount of their respective claims, a true copy of which liquidation is filed herewith, marked Exhibit "C" to this petition as will be fully seen by reference thereto; That your petitioner then proceeded to pay out said funds of \$49.45 in accordance with said liquidation, and expended all of the same accordingly; And your petitioner then proceeded further and paid off the whole amount of said claims in or about the first day of June 1866, out of her private funds, whereby she became the legal holder of all of said claims against said Estate, thus expending of her own money the amount of \$144.49 which she is advised she is now entitled to have allowed her out of the proceeds of sale of the real estate of said Henry Baum deceased, with interest on the same from the said 1st day of June 1866. the payment of which will be fully seen by reference to the said claims filed herewith marked Nos. 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, 13 & 14. and your petitioner humbly prays your Honorable Court to pass an order directing the Auditor in stating the account in this cause, to allow your petitioner the said amount of \$144.49. with interest from June 1st 1866, being amount expended of her own money in paying the debts against the estate of said Henry Baum dec^d. And your petitioner will ever humbly pray &c.
