Your petitioner would further show unto your Honor that Sarah C. Groshaw who was your petitioner's wife, died intestate on the 16th day of March 1868, having no children, after said report of sale had been ratified, and said real estate converted into personalty and your petitioner is advised that by the law of the State of Maryland he is entitled to receive his wife's distributive share of the proceeds of said sale, and said Trustee now has said money in his hands and is ready and willing to pay it over to your petitioner as soon as he has your Honorable Court's order for so doing, May it therefore please your Honors to order and direct said trustee to pay the said distributive share of said Sarah C. Groshaw to your petitioner. And your petitioner will ever pray &c.

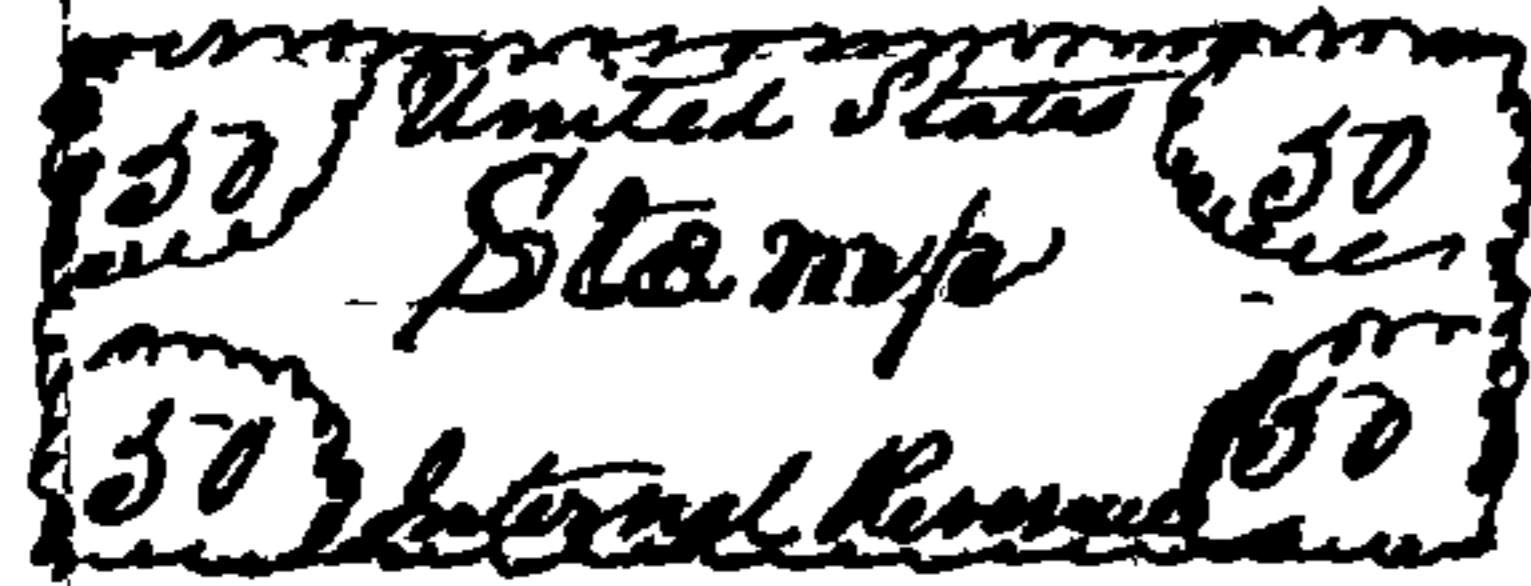

I, the Honorable Madison Nelson Circuit Judge for the third Judicial Circuit of the State of Maryland, sitting in the Circuit Court for Frederick County as a Court of Equity ~

The Bill of Complaint of Sycurgus N. Phillips Executors of the last Will and Testament of Noah Phillips late of Frederick County State of Maryland deceased - respectfully sheweth that herebefore to-wit on the seventh day of April in the year Eighteen hundred and forty eight, a certain Isaac Wright then of Frederick County State of Maryland, being indebted unto the said Noah Phillips in his life time on the sum of Fourteen hundred dollars by four notes Cash for the sum of Three and fifty dollars with interest, each bearing date the seventh day of April in the year Eighteen hundred and forty eight, the first payable two years after date, the second, three years after date, the third, four years after date, the fourth, five years after date, and intending to secure the same unto the said Noah Phillips, did in conjunction with his wife Mary Wright - by their deed of that date convey, unto the said Noah Phillips and his heirs, certain real estate lying and being in Frederick County State of Maryland and particularly described in said deed, to which said deed there is a condition that if the said Isaac Wright shall fail to pay and satisfy the said aforementioned notes with interest according to the tenor of the said notes as they shall respectively become due, and on the occurrence of such failure that the said Noah Phillips had power to sell the said land and premises - And apply the proceeds of sale in the manner prescribed by the said deed - All of which matters well more fully and at
