To the 1<sup>st</sup> Int. ~ That he is acquainted with all of the parties to this suit, and has known them all for some years. ~

To the 2<sup>d</sup> Int. That he knows the said real estate of which the said Frederick W. Kramer died seized and possessed; that he looks at Exhibits Nos. 2 & 3 now here shown him, and that the lands therein described are the same of which the said Frederick W. Kramer died seized and possessed. ~

To the 3<sup>d</sup> Int. That he was acquainted with Frederick W. Kramer formerly a resident of Frederick County Maryland; that he is dead; that he died at Frederick County aforesaid, during the winter of Eighteen hundred and sixty six, and before the month of February Eighteen hundred and sixty seven, and that he died intestate. ~

To the 4<sup>th</sup> Int. ~ That the said Frederick W. Kramer was married at the time of his death, and left a widow named Margaret, who now resides in Frederick County aforesaid, and the following children, namely, John A. Kramer, William B. Kramer, Sarah C. Kramer, Franklin B. Kramer, Mary C. Kramer, Lewis N. Kramer, Alice C. Kramer, and Virginia Kramer, who all reside in Frederick County Md., and who are all adults except Virginia Kramer, Alice C. Kramer, and Lewis N. Kramer, who are infants under the age of twenty one years ~

Georg Kessler, a witness of lawful age, being duly sworn and examined to interrogatories, filed with the Commissioner by the Complainant and herewith returned, deposes and says ~

To the 1<sup>st</sup> Int. ~ That he knows all of the parties to this suit and has known them all for many years. ~

To the 2<sup>d</sup> Int. That he knows the real estate of which the said Frederick W. Kramer died seized and possessed; that he looks at "Exhibits Nos. 2 & 3" now here shown him, and that the lands therein described are the same of which the said Frederick W. Kramer died seized and possessed ~

To the 3<sup>d</sup> Int. That he was acquainted with Frederick W. Kramer, formerly a resident of Frederick County Maryland; that he is dead; that he died at Frederick County aforesaid during the month of December or November Eighteen hundred and sixty six, and that he died intestate ~

To the 4<sup>th</sup> Int. That said Frederick W. Kramer was married at the time of his death; that he left a widow named Margaret, who resides at Frederick County aforesaid, and the following children, namely, John A. William B. Sarah C. Franklin B. Mary C. Lewis N. Alice C. and Virginia Kramer, all residents of Frederick County aforesaid, and all adults, except Lewis N. Alice C. and Virginia Kramer, who are infants under the age of twenty one years ~
