

Term of the Circuit Court for Frederick County in the year 1860, the Central Bank
 of Frederick, now incorporated and known as The Central National Bank of Frederick
 obtained in said Circuit Court a judgment against said Robert Annan for
 the sum of Four hundred and fifty dollars, as will appear by said judgment
 a true and certified copy whereof is filed herewith as Exhibit No. 5. ~ That your
 Orators are informed, and charge, that a part of said judgment has been paid,
 but how much they are unable to say. ~ That at the October Term of said
 Court in the year 1863, said Central Bank obtained a judgment against said
 Robert Annan for the sum of Seven hundred dollars, as will appear by a true
 and certified copy thereof filed herewith as Exhibit No. 6. ~ That your Orators
 are informed that a part of said judgment has been paid, but they are unable
 to say how much. ~ That at the February Term of said Circuit Court in
 the year 1862, a certain George W. Rowd obtained in said Circuit Court a judg-
 -ment against said Robert Annan for the sum of Two hundred and fifty eight
 dollars and seventy one cents with costs as will appear by a true and certified
 Copy of said judgment filed herewith as Exhibit No. 7. And your Orators have no
 knowledge if any or how much of said judgment has been paid beyond the
 sum of One hundred and twenty six dollars and thirty eight cents credited on said
 judgment, as paid on the first day of September 1868. ~ That at the February
 Term of said Circuit Court for the year 1859, said Central Bank obtained a
 judgment against said Robert Annan and a certain David Gamble for the
 sum of One thousand dollars and costs, which judgment was afterwards assigned
 to and entered for the use of said David Gamble, as will fully appear by a true and
 certified copy of said judgment filed herewith as Exhibit No. 8, but your Orators
 have no personal knowledge whether any or how much of said judgment has been
 paid. ~ Your Orators further state that said Central Bank, at the February
 Term of said Circuit Court in the year 1857, obtained a judgment against
 said Robert Annan for the sum of Two hundred and twenty dollars and costs,
 the same being No. 109 on the Trial Docket to said term; but your Orators are
 informed and charge that said judgment has been fully paid and satisfied
 to said Central Bank, though it has never been so entered. ~ Your Orators
 further charge that said Robert Annan paid to your Orators the interest
 on said Bond, filed as Exhibit No. 1, up to the 17th day of March 1863 as
 will appear by the credits endorsed thereon. ~ That he paid said Andrew Annan
 the whole of One year's interest, and one hundred dollars in part of the second
 year's interest on his Single Bill filed as Exhibit No. 3, as will appear by
 the credits endorsed thereon. ~ That said Robert Annan died some time
 early in the year 1866, leaving due and unpaid the whole of the principal
 sum of Money specified in said Exhibits, Nos. 1 & 2, as owing to your Orators
 and the interest thereon from the 17th day of March 1863, and that the time
 limited for the payment thereof by said Mortgage deed, has passed, and
 your Orators are advised that they are entitled to have said Mortgage prom-
 -ises sold for the payment of said Mortgage debt. ~ Your Orators further state
 that said Robert Annan died intestate leaving a widow, Mary J. Annan, who has
 a dower interest in said real estate, and Henry C. Annan and Annie E. Annan
 who has intermarried with Henry Galt, as his only children and heirs at law,
 to whom said real estate descended subject to the liens on the same, both of whom
 are adults. ~ That the tract of land specified in Exhibit No. 4, as "The Long
 Field", was purchased of Samuel C. Annan by Robert Annan, and the
 purchase money paid for the same, but no deed of conveyance has ever
 been executed therefor. ~ In tender consideration whereof, and for
