The said property shall not be subject to a division until the youngest child shall become of age ~

Item I give and devise unto my grandson John, Eldest son of Henry Webster, the house and lot now occupied by his father, but subject to his father's use until he the said Legatee shall arrive at the age of twenty one years in fee simple forever. ~

Item. I give and devise unto my son John B. Webster in trust for his children as before named a tract of <sup>land</sup> and adjoining the lot now occupied by my son Henry Webster, and supposed to contain ten acres, but the deed from Henry Nixdorff will more fully show, on condition that the within named legatee do support my widow during her natural life, or so long as she shall remain my widow ~

Item. I give and devise to my daughter Kitty McDade my blessing, and leave her to be provided for by her mother, which I have every assurance and reason to believe she will certainly do. ~

Item. For consequence of the great expense I have incurred in educating furnishing with trades, and setting up in business my two sons Geo. Turner, and William Webster, I am unable to give them any thing but my blessing and good wishes for their happiness and prosperity, which I most cheerfully do ~

And lastly I do hereby constitute my two sons Thomas and Geo. B. Webster to be my sole Executors of this my last will and testament, revoking and annulling all former wills by me heretofore made, ratifying and confirming this and none other to be my last will and testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this fifteenth day of May in the year of our Lord One thousand Eight hundred and forty ~

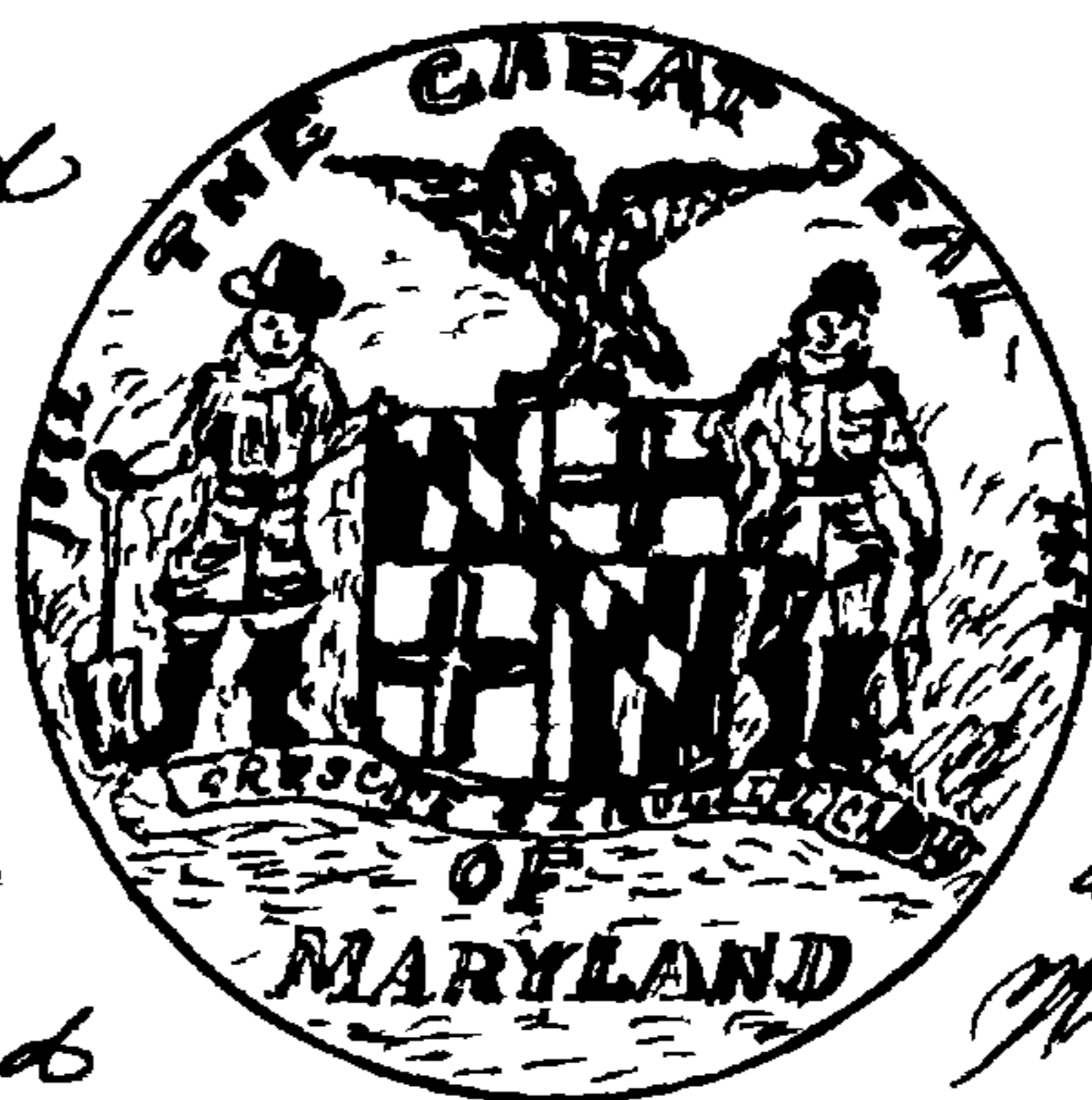
