Supplemental Proceedings

Petition of Catharine Marden and Others

To the Hon. Madison Nelson Circuit Judge for the third Judicial Circuit of the State of Maryland, sitting in the Circuit Court for Frederick County in Equity.

The Petition of Catharine Marden Widow of John Marden, Jacob R. Marden, Isaiah M. Scheldtrect by Jacob R. Marden his next friend, Jacob Smith of G, and Lydia Smith his wife, Rosanna Marden and Rebecca Marden, all of Frederick County State of Maryland, respectfully shews to your Honor - That a Bill of Complaint was filed in your Honorable Court by Jacob Marden and others entitled N<sup>o</sup>. 266<sup>th</sup> Equity, and that a decree was passed for the sale of the Real Estate in the proceedings mentioned, and that John Hoover of G, was appointed by the Decree, to make said sale, that said Property was sold, and that the Cause was referred to the Auditor to state an account for distribution, and that the sum of two hundred and Eighty one dollar and Eighteen cents, was audited to John Marden, and that said Audit was finally ratified by your Honorable Court; All of which will appear by reference to said Bill of Complaint, which your Petitioners pray may be taken as part of this their Petition; - Your Petitioners further state that the said John Marden left the State of Maryland some time in the month of June in the year Eighteen hundred and fifty five, since which time no tidings has ever been received from said John Marden and your Petitioners are advised that the presumption of law is that the said John Marden is dead. And that the Amount Audited to said John Marden in the Cause mentioned aforesaid decreed to your Petitioners as his heirs at Law. Therefore your Petitioners pray your Honorable Court to pass an order directing the said John Hoover of G, Trustee in the aforementioned Cause, to bring said sum of Two hundred and Eighty one dollar and Eighteen cents, with the interest thereon if any accrued, into Court and that said Cause be referred to the Auditor to state an account between the Trustee and the parties claiming the fund.
