John Fogle, of Henry.

On this 2nd day of April A.D. 1867, before me, the subscriber, Register of Wills in and for said County, personally appeared John W Barriack and made oath on the Holy Evangelists of Almighty God, that no part of the money intended to be secured by the annexed note, hath been received, or any security or satisfaction given for the same.

A true and perfect Extract from the Last Will and Testament of Henry Fogle late of Frederick County, deceased, which was executed on the 11th day of November 1816, and probated on the 10th day of April 1820 -

Item, I give and devise unto my son John Fogle the plantation whereon he now lives, called "Coppers Alley" containing 150 Acres of Land more or less, in case he gives his Mother such provender of his Orphans as above mentioned, and gives her 10 Bushels of Rye, 5 Bushels of Wheat, and five Bushels of Shelled Corn, 10 Hurdons of First Crop Hay, and Five Hundred of second Crop Hay; he shall haul said Hay in her stable, and bring said grain to her annually during her widowhood, and after so doing he shall have and hold the aforesaid Land and Premises with all its appurtenances in fee and clear Title to himself and his Heirs or assigns forever.

At the request of John Fogle the following Deed is recorded 24th July 1832 -

This Indenture made this Twenty third day of June in the year of our Lord One thousand Eight hundred and thirty two, between Conrad Oiler and his wife Ann Oiler, both of Frederick County and State of Maryland of the one part, and John Fogle of the County and State aforesaid of the other part. Witnesses, that the said Conrad Oiler and his wife Ann Oiler for and in consideration of the sum of One Dollar current money to them in hand paid by the said John Fogle the receipt whereof they the said Conrad Oiler and his wife Ann Oiler doth hereby acknowledge and themselves to be fully satisfied contented and paid, hath given, granted, bargained, sold, aliened, released and confirmed, and by these presents doth give, grant, bargain, sell, alien, release and confirm unto him the said John Fogle his heirs and assigns forever all theirs the said Conrad Oiler and Ann Oiler, his wife's right title, interest and property, of in and to, all that tract or parcel of lands
