This Mortgage made this ninth day of June Anno Domini Eighteen hundred and sixty three, between John Fogle of Henry, of Frederick County in the State of Maryland, of the first part, and William Fogle of the County and State aforesaid of the second part: Whereas the said John Fogle, of Henry, owes and stands bound unto the said William Fogle, by his note of hand, duly executed, and bearing date the sixth day of June Anno Domini Eighteen hundred and sixty three, for the sum of Four hundred and twenty two dollars and forty five Cents, with interest from the date, and payable in twelve months after date, as by the said note will more fully appear - Now this Indenture Witnesseth, that the said John Fogle of Henry, in consideration of the said sum of Four hundred and twenty two dollars and forty five cents, owing to the said William Fogle, as aforesaid, and for the securing the payment thereof with the interest to the said William Fogle his heirs and assigns, and also in consideration of the further sum of five dollars, to the said John Fogle of Henry, by the said William Fogle in hand well and truly paid, at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged by the said John Fogle of Henry, hath granted, and doth hereby grant unto the said William Fogle his heirs and assigns, all that Tract, piece, or parcel of Land, situate lying and being in Frederick County aforesaid, being part of a Tract of Land called "The Runway on Cooper's Alley" Beginning for the said Tract, piece or parcel of Land at Two Rounded Black Oaks, standing at or very near the end of the fourth line of a tract of Land called "New Georgia" it also being the Beginning of the whole tract, and running thence with the given line thereof reversed, North 29^o West 23 perches to the end of the last line of said whole tract, and with it reversed, South thirty two degrees West 16 perches to the end of last line of Seventy five Acres, part of said Land, conveyed by William Goodman to Michael Dutton, then with the given line thereof North 10^o West 12 1/2 perches to the end of the thirty second line of the aforesaid whole tract, then with the outlines thereof reversed four courses, North 48^o East 26 perches, North 26^o East 24 perches, North 26^o West 28 perches, North 85^o East 133 perches to the end of the eighth line of Forty three Acres, part of said Land, conveyed by the said Goodman to Henry Clauer, then with it South 14^o West 26 1/2 perches to intersect the eighth line of Twenty five Acres part of said Land conveyed by the said Goodman, to Valentine Celer, then with it South 74^o West 9 1/2 perches, to the end of said line, then by a straight line to the beginning, containing, clear of elder interfering surveys, the quantity of One hundred and Twenty five acres; To have and to hold the said described Tract of Land and every part and parcel thereof with the appurtenances thereto belonging, to the said William Fogle, his heirs and assigns forever, to his and their own use and behoof - Provided that if the said John Fogle of Henry his heirs or assigns
