In the name of God, Amen! — I John Fogle, of Frederick County in the State of Maryland, being old, but in good health of body, and of sound and disposing mind, Memory, and understanding, Considering the certainty of death and the uncertainty of the time thereof, And being desirous to settle my Worldly Affairs, and thereby be the better prepared to leave the World when it shall please God to call me hence, do therefore make and publish this my last Will and Testament, in manner and form following, that is to Say. —

First and principally, I commit my Soul into the hands of Almighty God, And my body to the Earth to be decently buried at the discretion of my Executor hereinafter named; — And after my debts and funeral charges are paid, I devise and bequeath as follows —

Item, first — I give to my wife Catharine the full use of my farm on which I now live, during her life, or so long as she shall remain my Widow, In Addition I give her my Churn, one Cow, two hogs, two Sheep, One tin plate, One iron pipe, One Mantle Clock, One corner Cupboard with Contents One Bedstead, and bedding, One Springing Wheel, two buckets, two tubs, My chest and contents, One Copper Kettle, one Iron Kettle, three Iron pots, One frying pan
