

to be paid annually, and to secure the payments of said charge &c. when due and payable together with the interest; The said Robert B Carlisle and Sallie Carlisle his wife, on the third day of July in the year Eighteen hundred and sixty five, executed a Mortgage to said Mary Claggett, covering all that part of Lot No 1 allotted to Barton Phelps and wife, distinguished in the division of Lot No 2 part of the Recovery on Maryland, and containing one hundred and two acres and one third of an acre of land, as will fully appear by reference to a certified Copy of said deed of Mortgage, herewith Exhibited Marked Exhibit No 4.

Your Complainants further state that no part of said Mortgage debt has been paid, or the interest thereon, since the third day of July in the year Eighteen hundred and sixty seven, but that the whole of said Mortgage debt with interest from the third day of July in the year Eighteen hundred and sixty seven is still due and unpaid.

Your Complainants further state that the said Robert B Carlisle died intestate as aforesaid, leaving a widow Sarah E Carlisle, and the following children him surviving, his heirs at law - viz - Cora Bell Carlisle - a daughter, Charles Abby Carlisle a son, Anna Laura Carlisle a daughter, Robert B Carlisle a son, all of whom are infants under the age of twenty one years - and who reside in Frederick County.

Your Complainants further state that letters of Administration upon the personal Estate of said Robert B Carlisle have been granted by the Orphan's Court for Frederick County to Sarah E Carlisle, who has duly entered upon the trust reposed in her as will appear by letters of Exemplification herewith filed. Marked Exhibit No 5.

Your Complainants further state that the personal Estate of said Robert B Carlisle is wholly insufficient to pay his debts.

Your Complainants therefore pray your Honors that a Decree may be passed in this Cause, to sell the real Estate thereof of the said Robert B Carlisle and proceed for the payment of your Complainants Claim with interest.

It is and therefore that the said Sarah E Carlisle Administratrix, Cora Bell Carlisle, Charles Abby Carlisle, Anna Laura Carlisle, Robert B Carlisle and Mary Claggett, may answer the several matters and things herein before stated, as fully and as particularly as if they were herein again repeated and they were thereunto specially interrogated, and that the real estate in the proceedings mentioned may be sold for the payment of your Complainants Claim, together with the interest due thereon - And for the payment of the Claims of all other Creditors of said Robert B Carlisle, who may come in and contribute to the expenses of this Suit - And that your Complainants may have such other and further relief as the nature and Equity of their case may require.

May it please your Honors to grant unto your Complainants the writ of Subpoena against the said Sarah E Carlisle, Administratrix of the goods and Chattels of Robert B Carlisle deceased, Cora Bell Carlisle, Charles Abby Carlisle, Anna Laura Carlisle, Robert B Carlisle and Mary Claggett of Frederick County, Commanding them to appear in this Court in person or by Solicitor at some certain day to be named therein, to answer the premises, and abide by and perform such Decree as may be passed therein, and as in duty bound &c.
