At the request of Robert B Carlisle & Mary A Morrison the following Deed was Recorded January 25<sup>th</sup> 1865. \$ 257 Stamp

This Deed, made this 20<sup>th</sup> day of January, in the year Eighteen hundred and sixty five by one Violetta G Boteler of Frederick County Maryland, Witnesseth, that whereas the said Violetta G Boteler by her bond of conveyance dated on the 19<sup>th</sup> day of March A.D. 1841 agreed and obligated herself to sell and convey to Charles Carlisle, the land in said County hereinafter described, for the consideration of Two thousand Five hundred dollars, and whereas the said Charles Carlisle, and his wife died several years ago leaving Robert B Carlisle Armistead M Carlisle, Charles C. Carlisle, & Mary Amelia S Morrison their only children and heirs at law, and whereas the said Armistead M Carlisle and Charles C. Carlisle have departed this life unmarried and without children; Now therefore, in consideration of the promises, and the payment of the said Two thousand five hundred dollars and the interest thereon, I the said Violetta G Boteler, do grant in fee simple, unto the said Robert B. Carlisle, and Mary Amelia S Morrison, the only heirs of said Charles Carlisle, all that piece or parcel of land, in said County bounded on one side by the public road leading from Roundettsville to intersect the Frederick and Harpers Ferry Ridge Road, and on the other side, adjoining the land owned by John A. Washington in his life time, and containing fifty acres more or less, it being part of the land owned by Amelia Phelps in her life time, and being also about one half the farm which was in the occupancy of the said Charles Carlisle at the time of his death.

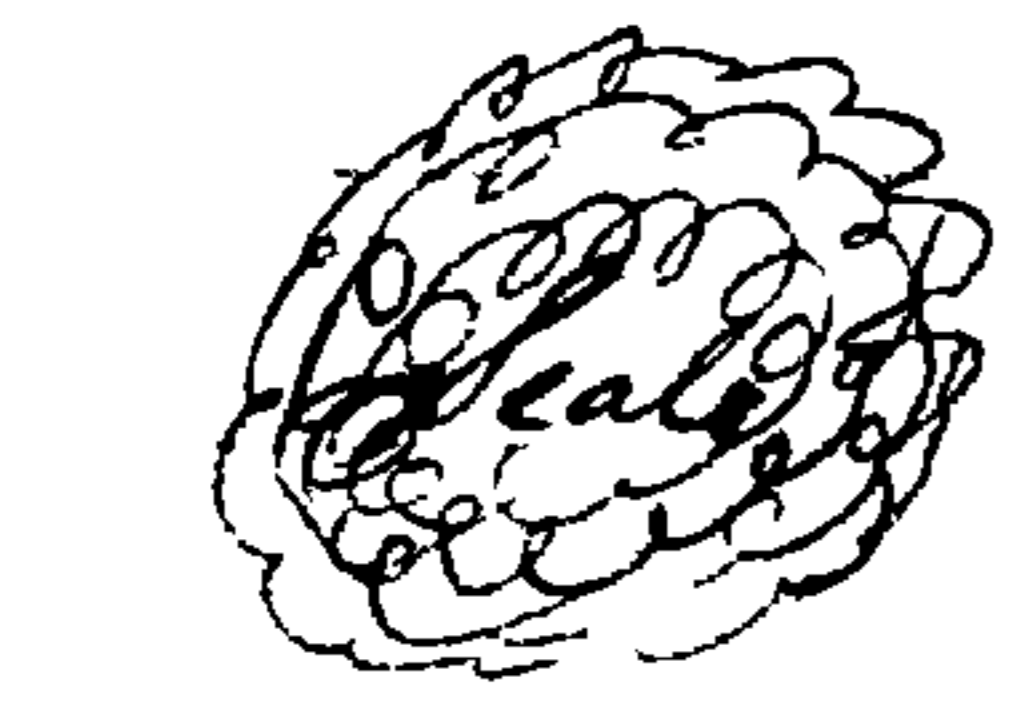
