

degrees West sixty two perches to a stone planted at the beginning of said deed, it being the end of twenty nine and a quarter perches on the sixth line of the tract of "Castle Henry" which was conveyed to the said Jacob Stupp for twenty five acres as aforesaid, then with said line reversed, North ten and a half degrees East twenty nine and one quarter perches to a stone formerly planted, then South seventy seven and a half degrees East ninety two perches to a stone now planted, then South one degree East forty one and a half perches to the first beginning containing thirty eight acres of land, and also all that part of the aforesaid tract of land called "Crambath" and "Castle Henry" which is contained within the following courses and distances; that is to say, Beginning for the same at a stone formerly planted at the end of the first line of fifty acres part of "Landst" which was conveyed by Jacob Romer and others to the said Jacob Stupp by deed bearing date the 22nd day of April, 1811 and running thence with said fifty acres part, at the same was formerly surveyed, South sixty three and a half degrees, West forty four perches to a stone formerly planted, South eleven degrees West sixty perches to a stone planted, then South seventy seven and a half degrees East ninety two perches, to a stone now planted, then North three fourths of a degree East one hundred and two perches to a stone now planted, at the end of thirty nine and three quarter perches on the first line of the aforesaid fifty acres part, then with said line, South eighty four and a half degrees, West forty perches to the place of Beginning, containing forty six and a half acres. To Have and to Hold the said parcels, or parts of tracts of land as as aforesaid described, and premises, with every of the appurtenances, unto the said David Stupp, his heirs and assigns forever, to his and their only proper use and behoof, and to and for no other use intent or purpose whatsoever.

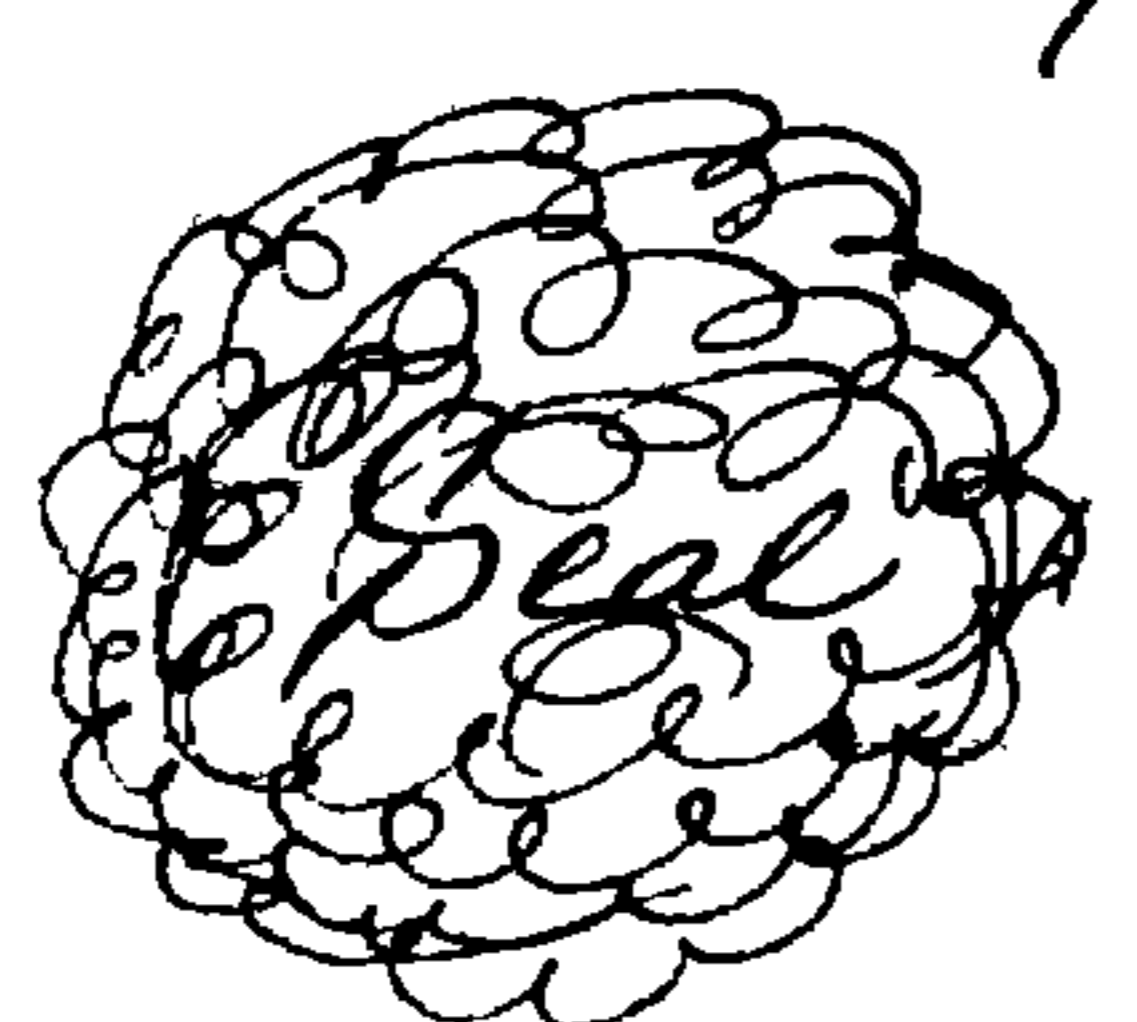
