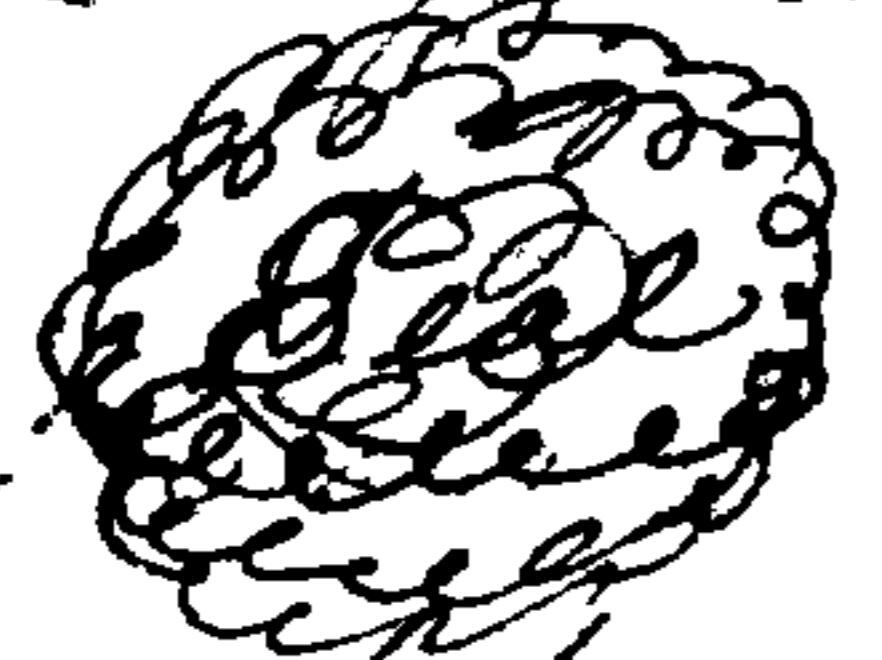

You are hereby commanded that all excuses set apart, you personally appear before the Judge of the Circuit Court for Frederick County, sitting as a Court of Equity, to be held at the Court House in Frederick town, in and for said County on the second Monday of February Inst. to answer the Bill and Complaint of The Frederick Town Savings Institution against you in our said Court exhibited, and so forth. ~

The Answer of David Stup of Frederick County State of Maryland to the Bill of Complaint of the Frederick Town Savings Institution filed in the Circuit Court for Frederick County in Equity against him, ~

This Defendant for answer to the said Bill, answers and says, that he admits to be true as charged in said Bill - That being indebted to the Frederick Town Savings Institution in the Note of Seven hundred and fifteen dollars, to secure the same he executed the Mortgage upon his real estate, a copy of which Deed of Mortgage is Exhibited Marked Exhibit No. 1 ~ This Defendant further admits that he received said note from time to time, and on the thirty first day of August Eighteen hundred and sixty five Executed his renewal note for seven hundred and fifteen dollars, which is for the same debt mentioned in said Mortgage, and is Exhibited in said Bill Marked No. 2. ~ Your Defendant further admits that the said note of seven hundred and fifteen dollars with interest from the third day of March Eighteen hundred and sixty six is still due and unpaid, and this defendant agrees and consents that such decree may be passed in the premises as may be consistent with Equity and prays hence to be dismissed &c. ~
