John St Young, witness of lawful age produced on the part of the Complainants, being duly sworn and examined to interrogatories filed with the Commissioners by the solicitor for the Complainants and herewith returned, deposes and says. ~

To the 1<sup>st</sup> Int: I know the parties to this suit, have known them for some years. I am the son of Samuel Young. ~

To the 2<sup>nd</sup> Int: ~ The Complainant sold Samuel Young 20 acres of land by the acre at \$100.00 per acre, to pay \$1,000.00, down in 1868 and \$1,000.00 in April 1869. The whole bearing interest from April 1868. I was present at the time when the contract was entered into. ~

To the 3<sup>rd</sup> Int: I am acquainted with said lands. They are accurately described in Exhibits Nos. 1 & 2, now shown me. ~

To the 4<sup>th</sup> Int: ~ Samuel Young paid part of the purchase money at different times, between the date of the Contract, which was a little over a year ago, and last February when he died; About \$50 was paid - About \$350, in work & labor. ~

To the 5<sup>th</sup> Int: ~ Young took possession a little over a year ago. ~ He cut down some timber and sold it, he exercised acts of ownership. ~

To the 6<sup>th</sup> Int: ~ Samuel Young, he is dead. Died in Baltimore in February 1868. ~ To the 7<sup>th</sup> Int: ~ Young was married at the time of his death, Susan Young is his widow and resides in Frederick County Maryland. ~



To the 8<sup>th</sup> Int: ~ Young left children, Mary C. John A., Samuel D., Sarah E., Susan E., Margaret A. & Ida F. Sophie and William O., all infants, and live in Frederick County. ~



To the 9<sup>th</sup> Int: ~ About \$700. is due with interest from April 1<sup>st</sup> 1868 and \$1,000. owing not yet due, with interest from April 1868. ~

To the 10<sup>th</sup> Int: ~ It is a small tract of land and could not be divided into convenient parcels. ~ It would be better to sell it all together. It would be better for the children and all parties; A narrow strip of land lying upon the road and running back of it, was sold in parcels, the purchasers of those lots back, would have no road out and it would bring more if sold in an entire lot, and the whole purchase money paid. ~

There being no other witnesses present to be examined and the Complainants requiring no further time for the production of their evidences, the Commissioners closed the said Commission, and herewith return the same, under their hands and seals this 18<sup>th</sup> day of November A.D., 1868. ~
