

due by the deceased, which are mentioned in his aforesaid administrations account, and for the payment whereof, allowances are therein made, therein to your Orator, were debts due and owing from the said Henry Willhite at the time of his death, and at the time of their payment by your Orator as Executor aforesaid, were properly chargeable against his real estate in the hands of his devisees.

And your Orator is therefore advised and charges, that he is entitled to have his aforesaid over payment reimbursed to him out of the aforesaid Real Estate left by his Testator. And your Orator further shows, that by the last Will and Testament of said Henry Willhite, a Copy of which is herewith filed Marked Exhibit D (which he prays may be taken as part of this his Bill of Complaint) All the Real Estate of the said Henry Willhite is devised after the payment of the debts of the said Henry Willhite, to Lucy Ann Willhite aforesaid for and during her natural life, and after her death, to be sold by your Orator as Executor as aforesaid, and the proceeds thereof divided amongst said Elizabeth Meisinger, Ann Hewitt, Catharine Harrison and John Willhite and Lucy Ann Willhite, all of which will more fully appear by reference to said said Exhibit C.

It is the End therefore that the said William J. W. Harrison and Catharine Harrison his wife, Betty Meisinger, Lucy A. Willhite and Charles Hewitt and Susan Ann Hewitt, may answer the several matters and things hereinbefore stated, as fully and particularly as if they were herein again repeated, and they were thereunto specially interrogated: And that the Real Estate of the said Henry Willhite may be sold for the purpose of repaying your Orator the sum of Money so as aforesaid by him, over and above the value of the personal Estate of the said Henry Willhite, which came to his hands to be administered, and of discharging such other debts due by the said Henry Willhite, at the time of his death, as may yet remain unsatisfied:

And that your Orator may have such further and other relief as his case may require.

May it please your Honors to grant unto your Orator the writ of Subpoena against the said William J. W. Harrison and Catharine Harrison, his wife, Betty Meisinger, Lucy Ann Willhite, and John Willhite and Charles Hewitt, and Susan Ann Hewitt, his wife, of Frederick County, Commanding them to appear in this Court at some certain day to be therein named to answer the premises, and abide by and perform, such decree as may be passed therein. And as in duty he

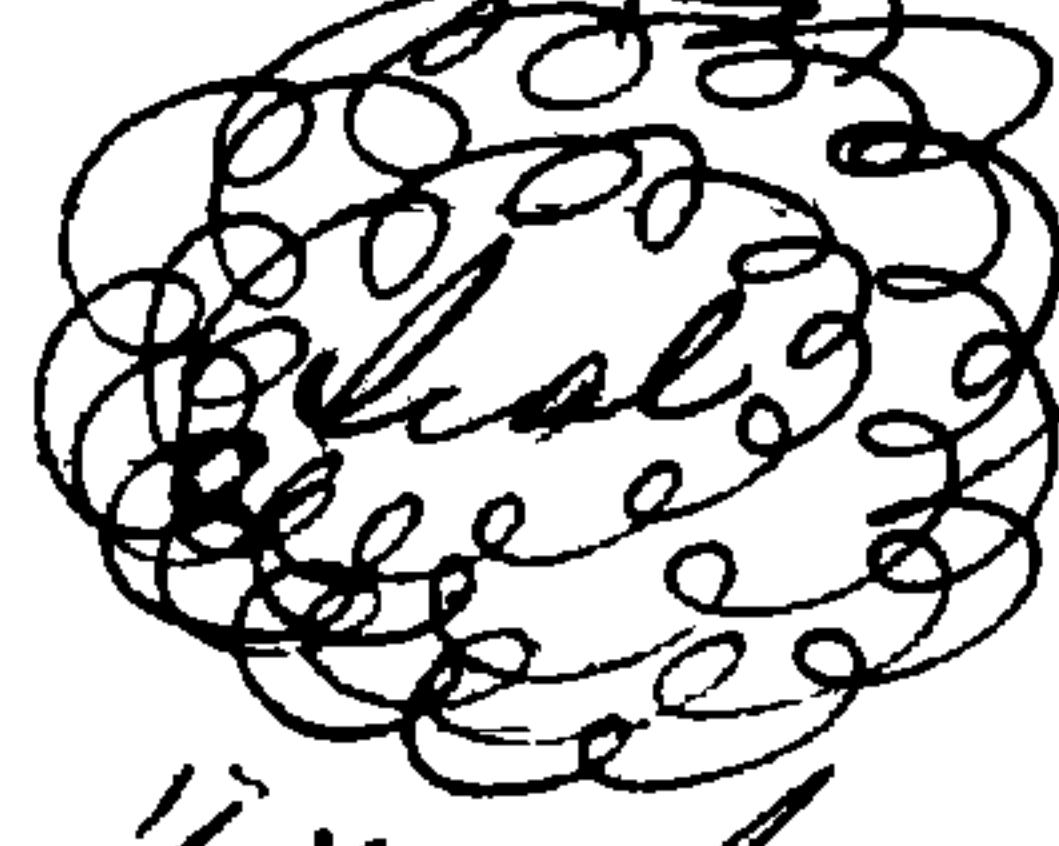
