May it please Your Honors to grant unto your Orator the writ of injunction against the said Henry Fogle, enjoining and strictly prohibiting him from cutting more of the timber on the premises described in these proceedings, than may be required for his own use - And also the writ of subpoena against the said Henry Fogle commanding him to appear in this Court, at some certain day, to be therein named, to answer the premises and abide by and perform such decree as may be passed therein. - And as in duty bound he will ever pray &c. -

Exhibit A. This Deed made this 10th day of May in the year 1859 by George W. Devilbiss and Ann Matilda, his wife, of Frederick County in the State of Maryland, Witnesses, that in consideration of One hundred and Eighty seven dollars and fifty cents of the said George W. and Ann W. Devilbiss do grant unto George Cramer of the County and State aforesaid, the two following described parcels of land, lying in the County aforesaid, both parcels being part of the farm, that was conveyed by G. W. Warfield and wife to Joshua W. Kemp by deed dated April 1st 1857 - Beginning for the first parcel, at the end of the fourth line of said deed, and running thence with said deed East 3 1/2 perches, North 3 1/4 West 35 1/2 perches to the south side of the Mill-race, then down the same to the public road, thence with the public road to the beginning containing seven and one quarter acres and twenty four perches. Beginning for the second parcel at the end of the twelfth line of the aforesaid deed, and running thence with the South 68° East 3 1/4 perches, South 65° East 32 perches, South 60 1/4° East 92 1/2 perches, North 58° 3/4 West 83° West 15 perches, North 76 perches, then to the beginning. -
