

the decease of my said son Thomas Sanderson, then as I wish that the principal of fifteen thousand dollars with any interest or dividends due or becoming due thereon, shall descend to and become the property of his Children, to be equally divided between them as tenants in Common, share and share alike, the issue of any deceased Child of my said son Thomas, if any such issue there should be, to have and take the part or share the parents of such issue would if living be entitled, and in the event of the decease of any of the Children of my said son Thomas under age and without issue, the part or share of him, her or them so dying, shall descend to the survivors or survivor of them, and in case my said son Thomas shall depart this life without leaving a Child or Children or descendants of the same living at his decease, then in trust for my son William R. his heirs, executors, and administrators absolutely, having every confidence in my said son William R. I hereby direct and order that he shall not be required to give bond and security for the discharge of the trust above named.

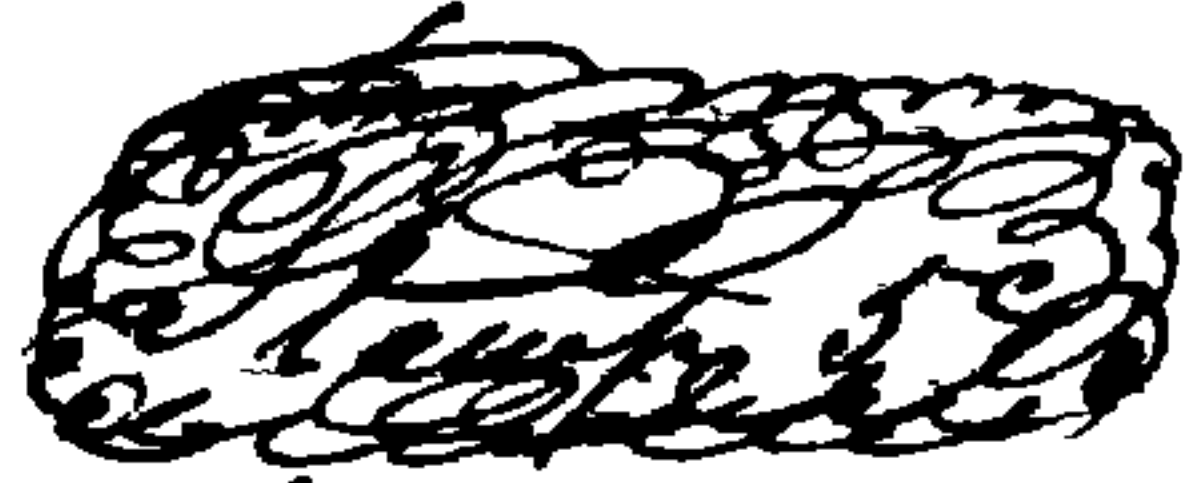
