

said parcels of land to amend and correct all errors and all contiguous boundaries -  
 I therefore certify that I have carefully resurveyed for, and in the name of law, the said John Miller, the aforesaid several parcels or parts of tracts of land, and find them to lay clear of each other and of older surveys, and that they contain the quantity of 357<sup>2</sup>/<sub>100</sub> 2<sup>1</sup>/<sub>100</sub> 08<sup>1</sup>/<sub>100</sub> of land, to which I have added two pieces of surplus land, parts of the aforesaid tract called "The Resurvey on Ramsburgs Chance" containing 2 acres, 1 rood, and 15 perches, which has been inclosed and cultivated by the said John Miller and those under whom he claims for upwards of 20 years - making in all 359<sup>2</sup>/<sub>100</sub> 3<sup>1</sup>/<sub>100</sub> 33 perches of land - And there being no vacant land contiguous thereto, I have reduced the whole into one general outline or entire tract by the following metes and bounds, Courses and distances, viz. Beginning at the end of 87<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> ps. on the 3<sup>rd</sup> line of the aforesaid tract called, "Hill in the Middle," it being at the end of one perch on a line drawn North 25° E from a stone now planted and marked J.M.R. No. 1, 1847 standing on the South West side of the public road leading from the Woodville Schoolhouse to Frederick Town - It also being the end of the third line of the deed from John Miller to Frederick Baker for 30<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> 2<sup>1</sup>/<sub>100</sub> 23<sup>1</sup>/<sub>100</sub> of land dated the 2<sup>nd</sup> day of December 1812, and running thence, with the given line of said deed, and with the second line reversed of the deed from Frederick Baker to John Miller dated the 5<sup>th</sup> day of September 1812 for 1<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> acre, part of the tract called "Hill in the Middle" one of the present originals, by one half degree allowance for variation N 25° E 39<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> ps. to a stone now planted and marked No. 2 at the end of the first line of said original, thence with said first line reversed correcting the bearing of the same so as to agree with its former location N. 8° East 20 ps to a stone now planted and marked No. 3, at the beginning of said deed, it also being the end of 49 ps. on the first line of the aforesaid tract called "Cronice's Chance," thence with said line reversed, by one degree allowance for variation N 36° E 43<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> ps. to a stone now planted and marked No. 4 at the end of the fourth line of the second part of the deed from Nancy Leatherman to John Miller dated the 14<sup>th</sup> day of December 1831, one of the present originals, thence with said said fourth line reversed, by one half degree allowance for variation S 73° W 44<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> ps to a stone now planted and marked No. 5 standing by an Oak Sapling, thence with the third line of said Deed reversed N. 57<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> N. 4 ps. to a stone now planted and marked No. 6 standing on the South side of a small branch at the end of the first line of the deed from Godfrey Kerouly to John Miller, for one half acre of land, part of "Hill in the Middle" dated the 14<sup>th</sup> day of May 1838, one of the present originals, thence with said first line reversed N. 35° W 20<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> perches to a stone now planted and marked No. 7 standing on the second line of the aforesaid tract called "Hill in the Middle" near a large Maple tree, thence with said 2<sup>nd</sup> line reversed by one degree allowance for variation N 44° E 16<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> ps. to a stone now planted and marked No. 8 standing at the end of the first line thereof, thence still North 44° E. 2 ps. to a stone now planted and marked No. 9 standing at the end of the 6<sup>th</sup> line of the deed of D.S. Pigman to John Miller for 169<sup>2</sup>/<sub>100</sub> 2<sup>1</sup>/<sub>100</sub> 20 ps. parts of the Resurvey on Ramsburgs Chance" part of "Cronice's Chance" and part of "Greenfelt," dated 16<sup>th</sup> day of January 1830 one of the present originals, thence with the lines of said deed, by one degree of allowance for variation N 43° E 7<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> ps. to a stone now planted and marked No. 10, S 42<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>° E 3 ps to a stone now planted and marked No. 11, thence with the 9<sup>th</sup> line of said deed by 3° allowance for variation N 15<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>° E 7<sup>1</sup>/<sub>10</sub> ps. to a stone now planted and marked No. 12 standing at the beginning of the deed from Nancy Lechliter to John Miller for 88<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> ps. of land, part of a tract called "The Resurvey on Furnstete" dated the 1<sup>st</sup> day of June 1832 one of the present originals, thence with the lines of said deed, making such corrections therein as is found ne-

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
