 $51 \frac{1}{2}$  ps. to a stone now planted and marked  $N^{\circ} 16$  at  $60^{\circ} W 18 \frac{1}{2}$  ps. to a stone now  
 planted and marked  $N^{\circ} 17$  standing at the end of  $1 \frac{1}{2}$  of a perch on the afore-  
 said  $9^{\text{th}}$  line of the aforesaid deed from B. S. Pigman to John Miller, then with  
 said  $9^{\text{th}}$  line by  $3^{\circ}$  allowance for variation,  $N 18 \frac{1}{2} E 105 \frac{1}{2}$  ps. to a stone now planted

 aforesaid deed from B. S. Pigman - then with the closing line of said  
 deed by  $1 \frac{1}{2}$  allowance for variation  $S 36 \frac{1}{2} W 132 \frac{3}{4}$  ps. to a stone now plan-  
 ted and marked  $N^{\circ} 21$  standing at the beginning of said deed; still with  
 the outlines thereof, correcting the same so as to agree with its original

 deed, also at the end of the  $20^{\text{th}}$  line of the deed from Peter Craven to John Miller  
 for  $2 \frac{1}{4}$  acres part of the "Resurvey on Ransburg's Chance" and part of "Lerouice's  
 Chance" dated the  $21^{\text{st}}$  day of October 1837, one of the present originals - then with  
 said second line reversed, corrected so as to agree with the original location  
 and present holding of the parties interested,  $S 68^{\circ} E 18 \frac{1}{2}$  ps. to a stone now  
 planted by a gate post, and marked  $N^{\circ} 25$ , it being the end of the  
 $6^{\text{th}}$  line of the deed from John Ritter to John Miller for  $7 \frac{1}{4}$  acres  
 part of "Lerouice's Chance" and part of the "Resurvey on Hauser's  
 Fancy" dated the  $23^{\text{rd}}$  day of September 1837 one of present originals, then  
 with the outlines of said deed reversed by such allowance for varia-  
 tion and such corrections as is found necessary to agree with its  
 original location  $S 29 \frac{1}{2} W 20 \frac{3}{4}$  ps. to a stone now planted and marked  
 $N^{\circ} 26 S 61 W 18$  ps. to a stone now planted and marked  $N^{\circ} 27 S 2^{\circ}$   
 $W 72$  ps. to a stone now planted and marked  $N^{\circ} 28$  standing on the  
 North side of a small Branch, then down said Branch  $S 85^{\circ} E 21$  ps.  
 ending in said Branch one perch from a stone now planted on the North
