To the 1st Int: ~ That he is acquainted with all the parties to this suit. Has known them for a number of years. ~

To the 2nd Int: ~ That he has a knowledge of the land John Meiller was seized and possessed of in 1852. ~ He owned all the land in Exhibit A to Commission, except the part in the part in the deed Exhibit B, and the part occupied by John W. Meiller, with which John Meiller told me before 1852, he had nothing to do.

He owned the whole of that described in Exhibit A, except 88 acres in Exhibit B, and 100 acres occupied by John W. Meiller ~

* To the 4th Int: ~ That John Meiller was married at the time of his death. ~ Sarah Meiller is his widow, and resides at the same place, Frederick County Md. ~

* To the 3rd Int: ~ That he was acquainted with a certain John Meiller late of Frederick County. He is dead. Died in Frederick County 10 or 12 years ago. ~

To the 5th Int: John Meiller left children, Daniel O. Married Mary Powers, George Meiller married to Mary Ann Crover, left Julia, married to Mrs. G. Brunner, Sarah married E. A. Brunner, Thomas E. married Miss Parsons, Winfield S. Meiller, John O. Meiller, infants, John W. and Julia Meiller his wife, Josiah N. Sarah E. married to John Brown, Matilda married to Jacob E. Palmer. ~

Peter Crover, a witness of lawful age produced on the part of the Complainants being sworn and examined to Interrogatories filed with Commissioners, and herewith returned; deposes and says ~

To the 1st Int: ~ That he is acquainted with the parties to this suit except Complainants ~

To the 2nd Int: ~ That he has a knowledge of the land of which John Meiller was possessed. Knew it for a number of years. Suppose it was about Eighty nine acres sold off to Crover. The whole tract contained between 380 and 390 acres. ~ In 1852 he sold off 88 acres and some perches to Samuel Crover. ~

To the 3rd Int: ~ That he was acquainted with John Meiller, he (John Meiller) died at his residence ten or twelve years back. ~

To the 4th Int: John Meiller was married when he died. His widow lives at the same place in Frederick County Md. where John Meiller died. ~

To the 5th Int: ~ That John Meiller left children, and children of a deceased child, Daniel O. Meiller married to Mary Powers, George Meiller, married to Mary A. Crover, left Julia married to Mrs. G. Brunner, Sarah married E. A. Brunner, Thomas E. married Miss Parsons, Winfield S. Meiller, John O. Meiller, infants, John W. Meiller and Julia his wife, Josiah N. Meiller, Sarah married John Brown, Matilda, married Jacob E. Palmer. ~
