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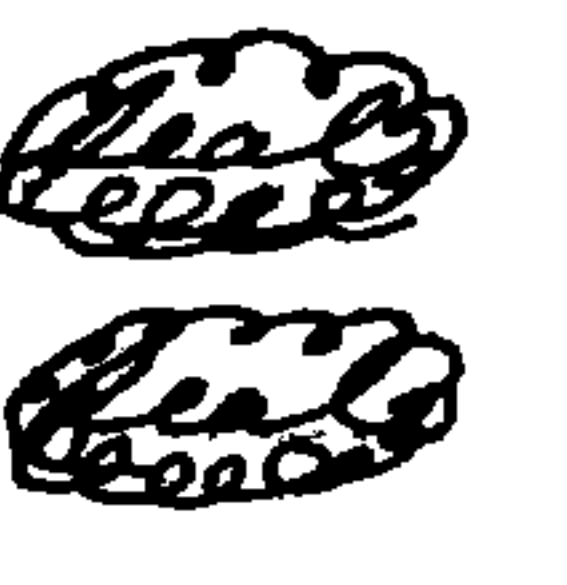

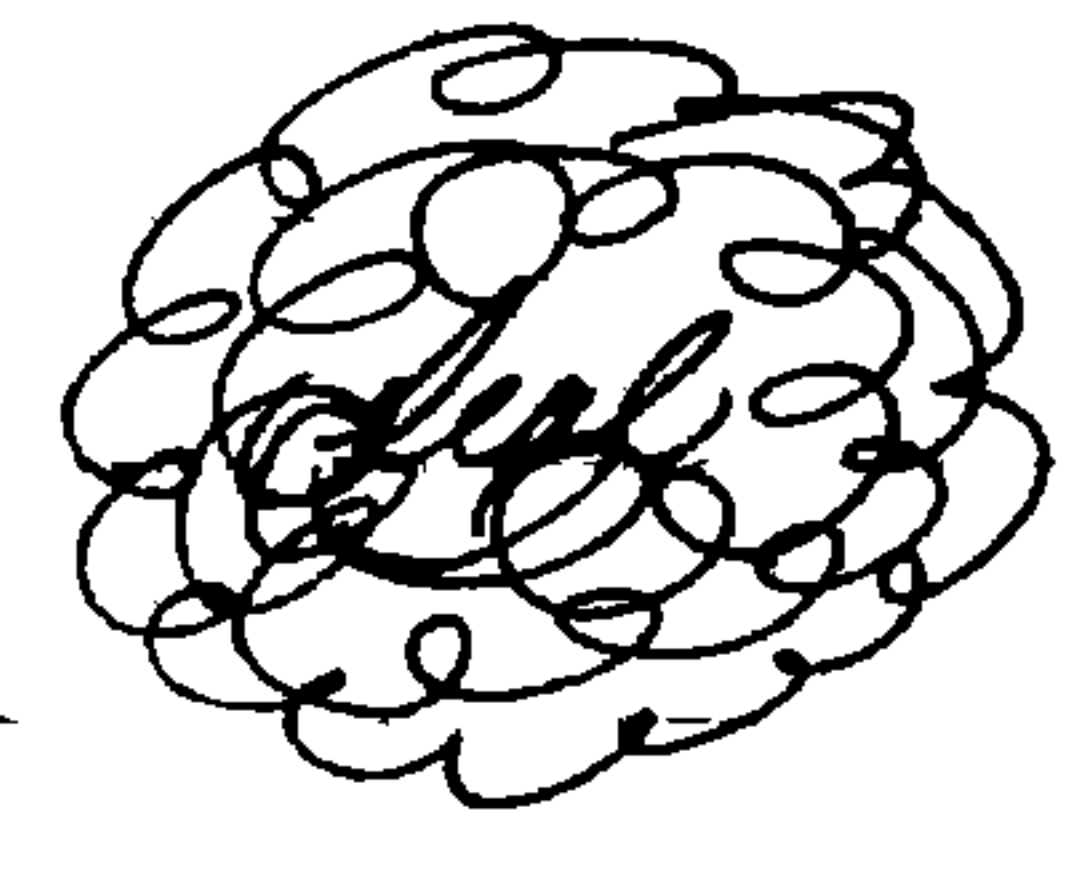

This Deed made this 18th day of June in the year 1859 by Upton R. Waltz & Rachel Waltz his wife of Frederick County State of Maryland, Witnesses, that in Consideration of One hundred and nineteen dollars the said Upton R. Waltz and Rachel Waltz his wife, do grant unto George Pfoutz of said County and State, all that lot or parcel of ground, situated in the County aforesaid, being part of a parcel of land which was conveyed to the said Upton R. Waltz by Elizabeth Waltz and others, by deed bearing date April Sixth in the year 1857 and recorded Jan. 29th 1858 in Liber B. G. F. No. 1 folio 149 & 150, one of the Land Records of Frederick County, it being a part of a tract of land, called by the name of "The Reservoir on Hunting Lot" Beginning for the same, at a stone standing at the beginning of a part of a tract of land conveyed by David Wampler to John Fox, by deed bearing date August 21st 1853, and running with the given line reversed allowing 3 degrees for East variation North 75 degrees E. 39 1/4 perches to a stone now planted, N. 26 degrees West 10 3/4 perches to a stone, South 78 degrees West 30 1/10 perches to a stone now planted in the side of the public road, then South 13 1/2 West 12 perches to the place
