

purchase money for said tract of land has never been paid, either by Benj. Todd, in his life time, nor by his heirs or administrators since his death; but that there is still due and owing said Trustee, on account of the said purchase money therefor, as the Complainants in said Bill are advised, some fifteen or seventeen hundred dollars ~

The Bill also states that the parties Complainants therein, are advised that they are entitled to have the said tract of land sold, the said Trustee to pay the balance of the purchase money, out of the proceeds of the sale thereof. ~

No. 6 ~ A house and lot in Parkersville, Carroll County, deeded to the said Benjamin Todd in his life time from John Cain and wife. ~

No. 7 ~ A tract of land in Howard County, containing thirty five acres more or less, being a part of two original tracts named respectively "Trouble for Nothing" and "Hampton Continued" which was conveyed to Benj. Todd by deed from William Runkles and wife. ~

No. 8 ~ Four fifths interest in one hundred and forty acres of land more or less, in Howard County, being all the right title and interest in and to said lands of Levin Hood, James Hood, Samuel J. Hood, and Joshua Todd Jr. as tenants in common with Letitia Hood, who married _____ Jackson of the state of Missouri. ~

The Bill states that the time of the death of Benjamin Todd, Levin Hood of Howard County owned one undivided fifth part of said Tract of Land as tenant in common with the said Benjamin Todd, and that he now owns the same interest in said lands, as tenant in common with the heirs at law of said Benjamin Todd, the said Levin Hood having purchased the interest of Rudolphina Jackson, who was the only child and heir at law of the said Letitia Hood. ~

No. 9 ~ A lot of about two acres of land in Carroll County, being a part of "Parr's Ridge" conveyed to the said Benj. Todd by George Haseltine. ~

The Bill further states that the said Benjamin Todd, died, leaving no lawful children, but leaving a widow, Ruth Todd - who was his lawful wife, and who since her late husband's death has intermarried with one Samuel E. Groom, and who is entitled to her dower in the real estate mentioned - and leaving the following Brothers and sisters and their descendants his heirs at law, to wit: Samuel Todd, Charles H. Todd and Rachel Todd his brothers. ~ Charles Brougle, Rachel Brougle, Mary Brougle, who married J. McHallen, Susan Brougle, who married John Adams, Margaret Brougle who married Rachel Todd, Sarah Brougle, who married J. Buxton, Ellen Brougle who married Upton Brown, all children and heirs of Lucy Todd, a deceased sister of intestate, who married John Brougle; Mary E. Todd who married Peter Davis, Grant Todd, Rachel R. Todd, who married J. E. Tucker, Ann Jeanette Todd Margaret H. Todd who married James P. Thompson, Susan L. Todd who married Henry Johnson, Benjamin H. Todd, Martha H. Todd who married William Brown - all the children and heirs at law of Alexander Todd, a deceased brother of the said Benjamin Todd.

James H. Brown, a child and only heir at law of Mary Brown a deceased sister of said intestate, who married _____ Brown.

All of which parties aforesaid are of full and lawful age, but not being able to agree among themselves, nor with other parties interested in the sale of the lands and premises mentioned, in reference to any sale or disposition of the same, are advised that their proper and
