

His wife, Thomas of Day and Sarah Day his wife and Upton Mullins and Jane
 Mullins, his wife, of Frederick County, respectfully shew unto your Honors,
 that George W. Wolfe, late of Frederick County, died intestate some time
 in the Month of December 1868, or January 1869, seized and possessed of
 about Twelve and one quarter Acres of land, situate in said County, and
 particularly described by the Courses and distances filed herewith as
 Exhibit No. 1; which with all other Exhibits herewith filed, your complain-
 ants pray may be taken as a part of this Bill of Complaint, as fully as if
 here inserted in words and figures; That said Real Estate was purchased by
 the said George Wolfe from one Benjamin Todd, now deceased, and the purchase
 money was fully paid therefor, many years since, although said Todd never
 executed a deed to said George W. Wolfe for the same, yet said George W. Wolfe
 had the entire and undisputed possession of said Real Estate, and exercised ab-
 solute ownership and Control of the same, without any one claiming any adverse
 title thereto for more than Twenty years prior to his death, and your Complainants
 are advised, said George W. Wolfe had a perfect fee simple title to said land
 at the time of his death, and that the same now belongs to his heirs at law; -
 That said George W. Wolfe died leaving Tricilla Wolfe, as his widow, and
 the following named Children and grand-Children as his only heirs at law, viz:
 Your Complainants Rachel wife of Evan Wilson Leach, wife of Thomas of Day,
 and Jane wife of Upton Mullins, and William Wolfe and Sarah Hood wife of Geo. W.
 Hood, all of whom are children of said intestate, also Leucinda Moxley, George
 Moxley, and Sarah Hood wife of Gasaway Hood, who are children of Kitty
 Ann Moxley dec^d who was a Child of said intestate, and Ann Le Fleming
 wife of William Fleming, William D. Wolfe and Daniel W. Wolfe, who are children
 of Leasia Wolfe dec^d, who was a son of said intestate, and who died before
 said George W. Wolfe. - That all said heirs at law, who now own said Real
 Estate as tenants in Common, live in Frederick County, with the exception of George
 Moxley, who lives in Montgomery County, and Leah Hood wife of Gasaway Hood
 and Ann Le Fleming wife of William Fleming who live in Carroll County, and
 all of said Heirs at Law are adults, with the exception of William D. Wolfe
 and Daniel W. Wolfe, who are minors; - And your Complainants charge
 that said Real Estate will not admit of division among said heirs at
 Law and tenants in Common, without injury and loss, and that it would be
 to the interest and advantage of all the parties interested, infants as well
 as adults, for said Real Estate to be sold by a Trustee to be appointed
 by your Honorable Court, and the proceeds distributed by your Honorable
 Court, and the proceeds distributed among said heirs at Law. -

In tender consideration whereof, and for that your Complainants
 are remediless in the premises, by the strict rules of the Common Law, and
 relievable only in a Court of Equity where matters and things of this
 nature are properly cognizable, and to the end that the said Tricilla Wolfe
 William Wolfe, and Susan Wolfe his wife, Geo. W. Hood and Sarah Hood
 his wife, Leucinda Moxley, Geo. Moxley, Gasaway Hood and Leah
 Hood his wife, Ann Fleming and Ann Le Fleming his wife, Wm. D. Wolfe
 and Daniel W. Wolfe, may answer all and singular the matters and
 charges aforesaid, and that said Real Estate may be sold by a
 Trustee to be appointed by your Honorable Court for that purpose,
 and that your Complainants may have such other and further relief
