To the 4th Sub: ~ That the said Ellen Baker did leave children, Nathan Le, married to Juliana Sleer, William, married to a Miss Warfield, Mary E, married to Daniel M. Snyder. Theodore Harrison Baker married to Fannina Mealey, Sarah A. C. married to J. W. Fogle, Samuel Jacob, married to Mary Warfield, Basil Baker, John Baker, over twenty one years of age. Remban Sedwell Baker, Martha E. Baker, infants under age. They all reside in Frederick County Maryland. ~

To the 5th Sub: ~ The lands of said Ellen Baker are not large enough to be advantageously divided among so many heirs. If the land were sold and the money invested, it would be to the interest of all the parties interested. ~
