This indenture, made this seventh day of January 1857, between William Waters, and Frances Le Waters his wife of Frederick County in the State of Maryland of the one part, and Ezra Doub surviving Executor of William Doub deceased and Trustee of Esther Doub, widow of said deceased of the same County and State of the other part Witnesseth, that whereas the said William Waters by his single bill of exchange date with these presents, stands indebted to the said Ezra as Executor and Trustee as aforesaid in the sum of Two Thousand Two hundred and ten dollars (\$2210.⁰⁰) to be paid on the 12th day of November A.D. 1857, and in the further sum of Three Thousand seven hundred and ninety dollars (\$3790.⁰⁰) to be paid on the 12th day of November A.D. 1858, with interest on each of these two sums to be computed from the first day of April next and payable semiannually thereafter on the 1st day of October and April, respectively, Now in consideration of the said sums of money so due and payable, and for the better securing the payments thereof to the said Ezra Doub, in the manner therein specified and also in consideration of the further sum of one dollar to him in hand paid, and the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, the said William Waters and Frances Le Waters his wife have granted, bargained and sold, and by these presents do grant, bargain and
