

To the 6th Feb: ~ That he does not know any other matter or thing which would tend to the benefit of the complainants in this cause. ~

There being no other witnesses present to be examined, at the request of the solicitor for the complainants, the Commissioners adjourn the Commission until the 27th day of January A.D. 1870, at which time, and the place above named, the Commission was proceeded to take the following depositions, to wit:

Cornelius Staley, a Witness of lawful age produced on the part of the complainants, being duly sworn and examined to special Interrogatories filed with the Commission by the complainants, and herewith returned, deposes and says. ~

To the 1st Feb: ~ That he does know the parties to this suit, and has known them for some years. ~

To the 2^d Feb: ~ That he did know Susan Gibson formerly a resident of Frederick County Maryland. She is dead. She died in Virginia during the late war ~

To the 3^d Feb: ~ That Susan Gibson was married at the time of her death to Joshua G. Gibson who now resides in Frederick County Maryland. ~

To the 4th Feb: ~ She left children, Fanny married to Robert S. Pundleton over twenty one years of age, and lives in the state of Virginia. Wm. M. Gibson, Agnes Gibson, James Gibson, Ann P. Gibson under 21 years of age, and resides in Frederick County. ~

To the 5th Feb: ~ That he knew Ann P. Dorsey, she has died since the war. She died in New Market District, Frederick County Md. ~

To the 6th Feb: ~ That she was married to Dr. H. W. Dorsey at the time of her death. He now resides in Frederick County Md. ~

To the 7th Feb: ~ That Ann P. Dorsey left one child, It is an infant under 21 years of age, and lives in Frederick County Md. ~

To the 8th Feb: ~ That he knows the lands of which Dr. W. Waters did seized and possessed. ~ He looks at Exhibits B, C, & D. and says that he knows the said lands are correctly described in said Exhibits. That he is thoroughly acquainted with the land. ~

To the 9th Feb: That the said lands certainly could not be divided advantageously among so many heirs. The way the buildings are situated at one end of the farm would prevent an equal and advantageous division, The proceeds of the sale of said lands invested for the infants, would be of more advantage to them than to let the land lie as it is. ~

There being no other witnesses present to be examined, and neither party desiring further time for the production of their Evidence, the Commissioners closed the Commission, and herewith returned the same under their hands and seals this 2^d day of February A.D. 1870 ~
