According to the true intent and meaning thereof, and the Acts of Assembly in such case made and provided. ~ Also at the same time came Barbara Earnest, wife of the said Abraham Earnest, and acknowledged the within instrument of writing to be her act and deed, and the land and premises mentioned therein, to be the right and estate of the said Solomon Earnest, his heirs and assigns forever, and relinquished her right of dower in the said land and premises and acknowledges that she did the same freely and voluntarily, being by us privately examined, from and apart and out of the hearing of her said husband, when making these acknowledgments, said she made the same willingly, without being induced thereto through fear or threats or ill usage from her said husband ~ or fear of his displeasure ~
