To the 3rd Sub: That he did leave a widow, Susan Maria Carush, she is about seventy years of age now, and in tolerable health. ~

To the 4th Sub: ~ That he knows the lands of which Solomon Carush died seized and possessed. ~ That he looks at Exhibits No 1 & 2, and says they give correct description of the lands of which Solomon Carush died seized and possessed. ~

To the 5th Sub: ~ That the said Solomon Carush died intestate, and he left the following children and heirs at law, Helen Carush married to John B. Baker, Anna Mary, married to John F. Byler, Solomon P. Carush and Mary E. his wife, who are over 21 years of age. Sarah E. Carush who is under 21 years of age. ~ All of them live in Frederick Co. Maryland. ~

To the 6th Sub: ~ The tract of land contains about 240 acres. It is thin, and might bring 35 or forty dollars per acre. ~

To the 7th Sub: ~ That he thinks it would be better to sell the said lands, it would not admit of advantageous division among the four heirs at law. The property is under oak, and decreasing in value, for that reason it ought to be sold. That he thinks the interest on the money would be more than the rent which the heirs receive ~

There being no other witnesses present to be examined, and neither party wishing further time for the production of his evidence the Commissioners closed the Commission and herewith returned the same under their hands and seals this 14th day of January A.D. 1870 ~
