The Bill of Complaint of Mary Ann Bereager, Joseph Murphy and Cecelia Murphy his wife, and Jacob H. Dronseberger and Mary Catharine Dronseberger his wife, all of Frederick County, respectfully shew unto your Honors, that John William Bereager, late of Frederick County, died sometime in the year 1864, seized and possessed of valuable real estate situated in said County, particularly described in Exhibits 1. 2. 3. 4. 5. 6. 7. 8 & 9. which with all other Exhibits herewith or hereafter to be filed, your Complainants pray may be taken as a part of this their Bill of Complaint, as fully as if here inserted in words and figures; that since John W. Bereager died, after having made and executed his last will and testament, which was duly admitted to probate by the Orphans Court of Frederick County, and whereby said John W. Bereager devised as follows. ~ I give and devise unto John David, my eldest son, and William Henry, my youngest son, all my real estate upon the following conditions, to wit, that the Orphans Court of Frederick County appoint two competent appraisers, Land Holders, to value and appraise my real estate at such price, then equally divided, between my wife Mary Ann and my two sons, John David and Wm Henry, and my two daughters Cecelia and
